
# Parish of the Blessed Sacrament Fourth Sunday of Advent December 18, 2022

### Dear Parishioners,

#### Dear Santa,

As the holiday approaches, it is again time for me to make my list of what I want for Christmas. There is not much I personally need; but there a few things I wish to ask for others. You see, our world is a troubled place and many have lost hope that it will get better. Therefore, the things I want are things that could make it a better place for everyone.

First of all, Santa, I think our world has forgotten how to dream. When I was younger, there were people who were inspired to make this world a better place. Some dreamed of ending hunger; some of ending war. There were those who talked of a time when all would be treated with justice and all could hope for a better life. The prophet Isaiah had a dream that a time would come when the desert would bloom, the blind would see, and exiles would be able to come home. It would be a time of rejoicing. But some say that such a world could never be and they were critical and negative of such "impractical" dreams. The result is that people stopped dreaming. Santa, bring us a dream we can believe in; a world where all can live in peace. Secondly, in order to build such a world, we will need some tools. We will need generosity to chip away at the greed that can blind us. We will need patience to soften the hearts of those who are angry. We will need trust to repair the divisions that isolate us into opposing camps...and we will need forgiveness to heal the wounds we inflict on one another. My third request is for an instruction manual to teach us how to use these tools. Actually, I think the manual already exists and many own a copy. The problem is that it is sitting on a shelf at home rather than being carried in one's heart. Maybe if we were to find a copy of the scriptures under the tree and we would read it and pray it, our lives would begin to change. There are a few other things I want to ask:

- --There is a war in the Ukraine. The cold, the desperation and the fear, make it an unbearable situation. Bring peace to Ukraine and to all countries where violence threatens people's lives.
- --There is a severe drought in eastern Africa. Many animals are dying and many people run the risk of famine and starvation. It is a place very dear to my heart. Bring rain to end the drought and food to end the hunger.
- --There are lonely people in the parish who have lost loved ones. Being alone is a heavy burden to carry. Bring them consolation and reassurance that all life is in the hands of God.
- --There are children neglected, abused, and unwanted. Bring them someone to love them.
- --And finally, Santa, bring joy to the hearts of all who will celebrate Christmas this year. May our hearts be grateful for all we receive in this wonderful and yet, imperfect world. I will again leave some cookies for you under the tree. By the way, Santa, our parish is going to undertake a capital campaign to replace the roof and repair the windows in the church. Slate and stained glass are very expensive. It will cost over three million dollars. If you happen to have a few extra pieces or slate or a little extra cash, that too would be appreciated. 
