

Dear Parishioners,

Divine Mercy Sunday. This weekend we celebrate a special solemnity emphasizing Jesus' divine mercy. It is a relatively new addition to the church's liturgical calendar; dating back to the year 2,000. On April 30 of that year, Pope John Paul II canonized Sister Maria Faustina

Kowalska, a Polish nun to whom Christ revealed his divine mercy in a series of visions. During the canonization, the pope extended the celebration of the feast of Divine Mercy to the entire universal church and determined that it would be celebrated on the Sunday following Easter.

Sister Faustina was born in 1905 in a village near Lodz', Poland. At the age of 18, she left home to go to Warsaw intending to join a convent. After two years she was finally accepted into the Congregation of the Sisters of Our Lady of Mercy. She remained a nun the rest of her life. In 1930, she began to show signs of an illness thought to be tuberculosis. She would live only a few short years after that. In 1931, she had a vision of Jesus in a white robe with red and pale rays emanating from his heart. Over the next eight years, until her death, she would experience a series of visions. Christ's divine mercy would be revealed and explained to her as Christ's love for man despite our sinfulness that separates us from him. The writings in her diary reflect the thoughts, prayers, visions, and conversations she had with Jesus concerning his divine mercy. Christ asked her to pray a novena to Divine Mercy beginning on Good Friday and ending the Saturday after Easter. Because of this, Pope John Paul assigned Divine Mercy Sunday to the Sunday following Easter.

The eighth day following Easter was already an important day. It was on this day that Jesus revealed himself to Thomas, who was not present the first time he appeared after his resurrection. (He had already given them the authority to forgive sins.) To combine this event with a feast honoring Christ's mercy seemed a perfect fit. Therefore, we gather this weekend, we proclaim Christ as risen, victor over sin and death, and the source of divine mercy.

The Communion Cup. After a long absence, we have reintroduced the cup at communion for those who wish to receive from it. As before, the option to receive is left to the individual. For those who are still uncomfortable receiving from the cup, it is not required. However, for many Catholics, being able to receive under both forms is spiritually important and we are happy to make it possible. Please remember that if you receive the cup, take it in both hands, drink, and then hand it back to the minister. Intinction (dipping the host) is not permitted.


