

Dear Parishioners,

Fathers' Day. The Gospel of Matthew begins with a genealogy listing the ancestors of Jesus on his father's side. It goes all the way back to Abraham. Every year, on Christmas Eve, it is read at Mass. The priest or deacon who reads it, usually dreads doing so. Most of the names are difficult to pronounce and, at first glance, they seem to have little to do with Christmas. For if Jesus' true father is God, why do we bother to list these men as his ancestors?

Of course, the purpose is not to trace his DNA, but rather to trace the history of the faith of the people Jesus called his family. These were men who from the time of Abraham looked to God for guidance and protection. They were the ones to whom God had made a promise. They held a special place in His heart. It was the faith of these men that guided Israel through the good times and the bad. Perhaps they were not Jesus' direct biological ancestors; but they were the ones who passed on the faith. They were men who realized they were not strong enough to do it on their own and so they looked to God for the strength they needed. By listening and trusting God, they guided, protected and loved the children God entrusted to them. What more could a father do? This Sunday is a day set aside in our nation to honor fathers. Good fathering is something we all need. We need men willing to guide, protect, and love us in faith, for the best of fathers are those who look to God to be their strength and then pass that strength on to their children. Please take some time today to pray for your father. Perhaps he taught you how to love by what he did; or what he failed to do. Then pray for all fathers. Pray that their faith in God might be a source of strength by which they guide, protect, and love their children.


