

Dear Parishioners.

Stewardship. A steward is one assigned to look after someone else's property. There are several stories in the Gospel about good stewards and not-so-good stewards. They were hired to care for and invest their master's wealth. When we talk about church support, we likewise use the word stewardship, because we are the ones entrusted with our master's wealth. Everything we have belongs to God. How we use these gifts determine whether we are good and faithful stewards. Every Christian has a responsibility of caring for the needs of the church (church, meaning the people of God, especially the poor and the needy). To ignore this duty is to be less than faithful. Yet the question is often what or how much should I give. Here are a few quidelines to follow:

Remember you are not giving to God from what is yours. Instead you are taking for yourself what God has given you to oversee. Do we take 90% and leave God 10% or do you take all but a little pocket-change for ourselves? Is my gift truly an expression of my generosity? Where no one has the right to tell us what we must leave for God, one must be honest in what they offer. That is the first requirement of a good steward.

One must plan for what they set aside. The traditional tithe in scripture is 10%. In order to do that, one must make a budget and set the money aside. Here is how it works. For every \$1,000 dollars you make, \$100 is left for God's work.

If your annual income is \$100,000, then your weekly amount is roughly \$200 for God.

\$90,000, then your weekly amount is \$180 for God. \$80,000, then your weekly amount is \$160 for God. \$70,000, then your weekly amount is \$140 for God.

(This is a 10% tithe based on 50 donations per year. It gives you two weeks off for good behavior. 5% would be half this amount or \$1 per week for every \$1000 of income.)

A tithe is a planned amount one leaves for God, so that God's work may be done.

One must also do what they can to make sure this tithe is used wisely. Where do the funds go and what percentage is overhead? Doing God's work is to see that the hungry are fed, the homeless are sheltered, the sick and imprisoned are properly cared for. Is my support being used to do so? In short, stewardship is not about a set percentage or amount. Our task is to see that our support is being used wisely and as God intended.

All of us are entrusted with some of God's wealth. Prayerfully consider your gift to the church and to charities that help the poor and needy. Are you using God's gifts wisely?


Flu shot Clinic

The flu season is upon us! Statistics show that the flu will cause up to 52,000 deaths in the U.S. this year. To help prevent this statistic from coming true we are having a flu shot clinic, sponsored by Hy-Vee's Pharmacy, in the school cafeteria on Saturday September 9, after the 4:30 Mass and on Sunday September 10, after all Masses until 12:00PM. This year's flu shot offers protection against both the seasonal; flu and H1N1 (swine flu). The shot is recommended for anyone at least 6 months old and especially for the elderly and those with medical conditions. There are no reservations necessary. The shot is free for those with Medicare or Medicaid . If you have private insurance Hy-Vee will bill your insurance for you. Refuse to catch the flu, take control and get your flu shot!


