



# A LETTER FROM FATHER JEFF

Praying the Rosary. Last spring at the end of a general audience, Pope Francis noted three aspects of the Rosary that should encourage us to pray it regularly.



- First, he said that the Rosary is a Fr. Jeff Grant "compendium of the entire history of our salvation." For centuries, the Christian faith has been spread to many lands by praying the Rosary, a completely biblical prayer. One must remember that until recent centuries books and the ability to read was not available to the large majority of peoples. The Rosary became a primary way to teach the essence of our Christian faith. It was the way that many missionaries evangelized others.
- Secondly, the Holy Rosary is "a powerful weapon against evil." Many saints, including modern saints such as Padre Pio and John Bosco, talked about the strength of this prayer.
- Finally, the pope said it is "an effective means of obtaining peace in our hearts."

Perhaps of all the various devotions promoted by the church, praying the Rosary is the most popular and universal. It was only in the 15th century that Pope Sixtus IV officially approved the Rosary. In the 13th century there is mention of a recitation of prayers and psalms that eventually developed into a series of 150 Hail Mary's. By the 15th century, the Dominican order had transformed it into a meditation on the life of Christ. In 1571, Pius V (a Dominican) established a feast entitled "Our Lady of the Rosary" and structured the Rosary around 15 mysteries of 10 Hail Mary's each. It virtually remained unchanged until 2002 when St. John Paul II introduced five new mysteries called the luminous mysteries. Nearly every pope from the time of Pius V has encouraged praying the Rosary. Pope Leo XIII asked that it be prayed against the evils of the Industrial Revolution, which he noted was deepening an imbalance between the social classes. A few years later (1937), Pius XI asked that it be prayed that the Nazis and Stalinists be led to penance. St. John XXIII prayed the Rosary for new born children and encouraged others to do the same. St. John Paul II asked that it be recited for "the critical issues facing families diminished by the forces of disintegration. Our current pope, Francis, has asked it be prayed to unite us as a spiritual family and that we might overcome this time of trial.

October is the month dedicated to the Rosary. I encourage you to pray it so that our present generation may know our faith, resist evil, and restore peace to our world and our hearts.

Don't forget. This coming weekend we will hold the annual Blessed Sacrament Auction for the benefit of our school. This is a primary fundraiser to help hold down the cost of tuition. Your support, both financially and spiritually is appreciated.


