

A LETTER FROM FATHER JEFF

Humility The pharisees and scribes were knowledgeable and skilled when it came to matters of religion and faith. They were people who had studied and practiced the faith in a way that was pleasing to God...or so they thought. Unlike the "tax collectors and prostitutes" who listened to Jesus, the

pharisees and scribes were convinced that they were on the right path to God. It angered them when Jesus criticized them. Who was he? Where did he study? It was this smug attitude that exposed them as hypocrites. Despite their knowledge and skill, they lacked the humility to confess their sins. They could neither admit their sins to God or to themselves. Instead, they looked down on others as something less than true children of Israel. These prostitutes and tax collectors are the ones who cause the problems and deserve the wrath of God; and because of this attitude, the scribes and pharisees could not listen with honesty to Jesus, the Son of God. It was this hypocrisy that closed their eyes and hearts to God.

This same hypocrisy lives in our world today. The troubles in our world are never caused by us, they are caused by "those other people." We are not to blame. Superiority comes with an attitude. It causes one to think they know what God wants, yet prevents them from listening to His voice. The solution to this sin is humility.

Unless you are a sinner and admit your sins, Christ cannot enter your heart and heal it. Unless you see yourself among the "tax collectors and prostitutes", you may know the cross, but you will never truly feel its saving power. The greatest threat to our faith is not the enemy out there. It is the hypocrisy that keeps us from uniting ourselves with "the others." Christ died for all of us. The question is are we humble enough to see we are as much in need of His healing as the "big" sinners. Can we open our eyes and hearts to this love?


