#### A LETTER FROM FATHER JEFF

#### Who do you love?

My first assignment after ordination was as an assistant pastor at St. Paul's in Highland, IL. My pastor was a priest by the name of Fr. Martin (Mitz) Mangan. Even back then he was legendary. Fr.

Mangan taught me a great deal about how to treat people. I remember he told me to keep in mind that every person who came to the door was Jesus and to treat them as you would Him. One day the secretary came to get me. There was a man at the door who needed help. "He's a little strange," she told me. "Be careful." As I invited him in, it was clear to me that he was about three sheets to the wind. I asked him what I could do for him and he told me he needed \$10. I'm sorry, I said. We do not give out money. What is it that you need? By now he was angry. I need \$10, he said and if I didn't give it to him, he would punch my lights out (or something to that effect). That evening, I told Fr. Mangan that Jesus came to the door today...and he offered to punch my lights out. Fr. Mangan just laughed and said I probably deserved it.

In the Gospel we hear this weekend, Jesus reminds his disciples that everything we do for the least of these, we do for Him. Every time I read this Gospel, I think of Fr. Mangan. He believed that the person who came to the door was Jesus and the way you treated them would determine whether or not you would enter the kingdom. In all the Gospels, this is the only passage where Jesus talks about that last day and what are the requirements for entering the kingdom. The basis of judgement is not the virtue of faith; but rather, the virtue of love. The basis of judgement is not whether you call out Lord, Lord or make a profession of faith. It is whether you live it. It is what you do for the poor, or the hungry, or the sick, or the needy. Did you treat them with compassion? Did you treat them with dignity? True faith in Jesus cannot be separated from love love for God, and love for our neighbor. Fr. Mangan never stopped loving God's people. I hope I can do the same...even the ones who threated to punch my lights out.

(Fr. Mangan grew up in Blessed Sacrament Parish and attended Blessed Sacrament School. He died in 2001)
