

A LETTER FROM FATHER JEFF

Reflections on Mary

It seems appropriate to me that the Feast of the Immaculate Conception should fall during the season of Advent. The root of both this feast and this season is a promise; a promise that God would send his anointed one. The Fr. Jeff Grant difference is that the feast recalls Mary.



who was among a people awaiting the Lord's first coming. Advent is about those who wait for him to come again. The similarity is that both groups are waiting.

Mary plays an important role in this first coming of Christ. She is his mother, a role no other saint can claim. It is her cooperation with God's plan that made it possible. Like those of us who believe that Jesus will return, she had nothing more than a promise. She was among those who looked to a day when God would fulfill that promise. To be sure, there were those who doubted. There were those who gave up on God and those who dismissed the whole thing as nothing more than a fairy tale. But Mary continued to pray and believe. One needs only to read the Canticle of Mary (Luke 1:46-55) to see her faithfulness. Her focus was on God's goodness and not the disappointments of the world. Thus, she waited with patience.

Mary also demonstrates openness to God's spirit. God did not interfere with her free will and she did not assert her "rights." When the angel approached her with God's request, her question was not about herself. It wasn't about what I must do or what's in it for me? Rather, it was how will this happen? The focus was on God's plan. Would that be our focus?

Thirdly, Mary responded generously to God's request. Her response was "thy will be done." In a world where nothing interferes with my freedom, her response seems somewhat incredible. I wonder...is it freedom or faith and love that will achieve God's will? Mary's response seems to point to the latter.

Mary can indeed teach us how to live in a time of advent. She did so with patience, perseverance, openness to God's plan, and a generous spirit. By the same virtues, we too, can live in a way that prepares us for Christ's second coming. May His promise come to fulfillment for us!

Don't forget this Friday is the Feast of the Immaculate Conception, a holy day of obligation. Masses are at 5:30 pm Thursday, and 8:20 am and 5:30 pm on Friday.





Immaculate Conception

"Immaculate Mary, your praises we sing!" December 8th is one of our feasts celebrating Mary - the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception. From the beginnings of the Church, spiritual writers and theologians have acknowledged the innocence and holiness of Mary. St. Irenaeus called her the "new Eve." Both faced with the pure freedom to accept or reject God, Mary began with work of redemption with her yes to Christ! The Church began to celebrate the feast of Mary's conception in the early Middle Ages. In 1854, Pope Pius IX infallibly declared that Mary was free of original sin from the first moment of her conception. On this feast day, we celebrate the beauty and goodness of Our Lady!
