





FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Rest in Peace, Pope Francis!

Happy Easter! As we're still in the Octave, we still treat today as another "Easter Sunday." And as important as fasting was during the 40 days of Lent, it's important also to keep the *feasting* tradition of the Church throughout the season of Easter (which is 50 days, up until Pentecost). No need to go overboard, of course—but it is the Resurrection after all, so it bears celebrating!

One thing that will no doubt bring a temporary pause to our celebrations is the sad news of this past Monday that our Holy Father Pope Francis has died of a stroke and subsequent heart failure at the age of 88. It was certainly not news I was expecting to wake up to on Easter Monday, and yet I can't help but find it fitting on some level: that while we as a Church are so intentional these days about praying with the reality of the Resurrection, His Holiness has "returned to the house of the Father," to borrow a phrase from Kevin Cardinal Ferrell's announcement of the Pope's death. How beautiful that his last public appearance was to address the crowds gathered for the annual Easter Urbi et Orbi blessing in St. Peter's Square! How appropriate that his last public words (granted, they were read aloud on his behalf) were so focused on the reality of the resurrection, while he managed a simple but profound: "Brothers and sisters, happy Easter." Having spent some days in the square listening to him address the crowds, I can almost hear him speak the words with his characteristic almost-slurred Argentine Italian. As we celebrate this Sunday the Feast of Divine Mercy, let's continue to commend our Holy Father's soul to God the Father, that for his great service to the Church, Francis would be looked upon with an equal mercy. And please, pray for the College of Cardinals as they discern the next Vicar of Christ!

I'll leave you with a few excerpts from Pope Francis's last Urbi et Orbi address: Christ is risen, alleluia!

Dear brothers and sisters, Happy Easter! ...

Love has triumphed over hatred, light over darkness and truth over falsehood. Forgiveness has triumphed over revenge. Evil has not disappeared from history; it will remain until the end, but it no longer has the upper hand; it no longer has power over those who accept the grace of this day.

Sisters and brothers, especially those of you experiencing pain and sorrow, your silent cry has been heard and your tears have been counted; not one of them has been lost! In the passion and death of Jesus, God has taken upon himself all the evil in this world and in his infinite mercy has defeated it. He has uprooted the diabolical pride that poisons the human heart and wreaks violence and corruption on every side. The Lamb of God is victorious! That is why, today, we can joyfully cry out: "Christ, my hope, has risen!" (Easter Sequence).

The resurrection of Jesus is indeed the basis of our hope. For in the light of this event, hope is no longer an illusion. Thanks to Christ — crucified and risen from the dead — hope does not disappoint! Spes non confundit! (cf. Rom 5:5). That hope is not an evasion, but a challenge; it does not delude, but empowers us....

Christ is risen! These words capture the whole meaning of our existence, for we were not made for death but for life. Easter is the celebration of life! God created us for life and wants the human family to rise again! In his eyes, every life is precious! The life of a child in the mother's womb, as well as the lives of the elderly and the sick, who in more and more countries are looked upon as people to be discarded....

Dear brothers and sisters,

In the Lord's Paschal Mystery, death and life contended in a stupendous struggle, but the Lord now lives forever (cf. Easter Sequence). He fills us with the certainty that we too are called to share in the life that knows no end, when the clash of arms and the rumble of death will be heard no more. Let us entrust ourselves to him, for he alone can make all things new (cf. Rev. 21:5)!

Happy Easter to everyone!!


