



FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Habemus Papam!

For the record, I know this article is a little behind the news cycle—but the way our bulletin deadlines occur, this is the first issue wherein we can celebrate our new Pope Leo XIV! So for what it's worth, here are some thoughts on the conclave/election of the first American pope.

I don't know about you, but I have found in my limited experience that there's something extremely moving about watching a conclave occur. Just think about how many people stopped what they were doing on an otherwise random weekday and had their eyes glued to a smokestack (and then subsequently a balcony on the front of St. Peter's) half the world away...it boggles the mind. It seems as though the whole world—Catholic and not stops and stands at attention to see who might be elected the next leader of the universal Church. People in every distant corner of the earth are abuzz as the intriguing process begins to unfold, potential candidates are discussed, and speculations are made about what qualities the Church might expect to see in its next pope.

It's fascinating to me how enamored by the conclave and a new pope the world becomes, especially given the (sometimes) general disinterest with which some people treat the Church and Church-related things. If I had to guess why, I think it's because there's something intriguing to people about the mystery involved. The process is so ancient and has undeniably a touch of the "foreign" (in the sense of outside our experience) to it, like when England receives a new monarch.

But I suspect that there's more to it than that. I think there's a captivation with this whole papal process because, ultimately, there's something transcendent about it, supernatural, touching on the Holy Spirit. And try as we might to naturalize so many things in our world, there's irrefutably something otherworldly going on here. Even in the midst of the politicking and speculating and posturing that leads up to the "Extra omnes!", there's a will that is not just our own (or the cardinals' own) at play. And that most certainly commands our attention.

I, for one, am incredibly excited to see what Pope Leo XIV brings to the Church. Without a doubt, the Holy Spirit has called him to lead the Church at this particular juncture for a reason. Will he be perfect at that job? Certainly not. (And none of his predecessors were, even the saintly ones!) But with his cooperation and our prayers, our new Holy Father will be exactly what the Church needs him to be: the vox Christi, the successor to the Apostle St. Peter, and the one entrusted with the high call of proposing the Gospel of Jesus Christ as the solution to every problem of our world and times.

There's an almost irresistible desire on the part of the media and the world at large to start scrutinizing every decision Pope Leo XIV makes to see "what kind of pope" he's going to be. Might I suggest this instead as more properly the posture of faith: let the man reign and see what gifts the Holy Spirit brings forth in his ministry. I once complained as a seminarian about how hard preaching was, and the priest reminded me rather poignantly: "Yeah, it's going to be hard, because you haven't yet received the grace to preach! That comes with ordination!"

As tempting as it may be to look to Cardinal Prevost's past to indicate what might come in his years as Supreme Pontiff or to look at his every move now to predict what may come, let's spend our energies instead praying for the man and his Office. May the graces that the Holy Spirit pours out upon Pope Leo XIV for this Petrine service be received with an open heart and mind, and may they be used for the edification of the Church and the propagation of the faith throughout the world!
