



#### FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

#### Our Parish's Solemnity

This coming Sunday, we celebrate the Solemnity of *Corpus Christi*, also known as the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ—traditionally celebrated in the Church on the Thursday after Trinity Sunday, but moved in most dioceses of the United States to the following Sunday. This solemnity was first proposed by St. Thomas Aquinas (c. 1260) in order to emphasize the joy of the Eucharist being the true Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity of Jesus. In fact, St. Thomas wrote most of the prayers for the Mass himself, as well as some hymns associated with the Eucharistic devotion (like the hymns we sing at the beginning and end of Eucharistic exposition).

While this solemnity is an important one for the whole Church, it's perhaps *especially* important to us here at Blessed Sacrament, as it's our namesake feast as well. Few people acknowledge it or celebrate it these days, but a parish's patronal feast day is meant to be celebrated for that parish as a solemnity. So, for example, the Feast of St. Agnes (January 21)—while it is everywhere in the Church celebrated as a memorial of that saint—for the *Parish of St. Agnes*, it's a solemnity, and so for the individuals of that parish, it is recommended by the Church that it be celebrated as a day of great joy! In our case, our patronal feast is already a solemnity for the wider Church as well—the Solemnity of *Corpus Christi*—but it doesn't mean it shouldn't go without our local celebration and festivity!

So what do we do to celebrate our parish (especially in this centennial year of our parish's existence)?! Well, one of the important ways we commemorate this feast is by holding our annual *Corpus Christi* procession. Perhaps you've taken part in it in the past or perhaps you have not—but after the 10:30 Mass, we as a parish gather to process the Eucharist around our block. And maybe that doesn't seem like that big of a deal, but that action is an important one, and I would argue one that our world desperately needs. Especially as a parish dedicated to the Blessed Sacrament and one that promotes devotion to that Sacrament through Perpetual Adoration—what we do by processing the Eucharist around our neighborhood is **claim our streets, our homes, our city, and our families for Jesus Christ**. We publicly profess our faith in the Presence of Jesus in this most hallowed Sacrament and we hold Him up to the world as the solution to the longings of every human heart. Where the Presence of God resides, evil has no place—and so our procession through the streets may seem inconsequential to some, but for those who believe, its importance is not lost.

In a world that is quickly jettisoning ritual (i.e. symbolic) action for more a more pragmatic functionalism, I would argue that this is the exact kind of thing that our world needs. It's what makes Catholicism markedly different, these very tangible demonstrations of our faith. It reminds us that our call isn't just to privately adhere to the faith we have received, but to take it to the streets: to proclaim to the world that Jesus Christ is Lord and that He is HERE.

So whether you've been part of our procession for years or whether you've never done something like this before, come on out!! Let's celebrate our Parish of the Blessed Sacrament by showing the world the One in whom we place all our hope.

Afterwards, we plan on celebrating Fr. Tomy and his time with us here at Blessed Sacrament by sending him off to his new assignment with some refreshments and fellowship. Don't forget to join us for that as well!




