



#### FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

#### The Quiet Prayers of the Mass (Continued!)

This week, we'll pick up where we left off, starting with the silent prayers of the Mass that are offered at the time of the Preparation of the Gifts. The Preparation of the Gifts, or the "Offertory" as it is sometimes called, is a significant part of the Mass. It often gets overlooked as a sort of in-between time of the Liturgy, but in reality, it is the time when the people are (physically and spiritually) meant to be offering their gifts, prayers, and supplications to the Lord, metaphorically placing their needs and treasures on the altar of the Lord.

During that time, the priest or deacon begins preparing the altar. The first prayers that the priest prays are sometimes called the "Berakah" prayers, from the Hebrew word for "blessing." These prayers can be offered silently or aloud and are meant to offer praise to God (literally, "blessing" God, which is an action unique to the Judeo-Christian mindset) for the gifts which will become the Body and Blood of Christ, as well as asking God to sanctify the offerings we present.

"Blessed are you, Lord God of all creation, for through your goodness we have received the bread we offer you: fruit of the earth and work of human hands, it will become for us the bread of life."

"Blessed are you, Lord God of all creation, for through your goodness we have received the wine we offer you: fruit of the vine and work of human hands, it will become our spiritual drink."

If the Berakah prayers are spoken aloud (as they often are at daily Mass when there is no music to cover the ritual action), the people respond, "Blessed be God forever."

Between the "berakah" prayers, as the priest prepares the chalice to be offered, a small amount of water is poured into the wine while the following prayer is prayed:

"By the mystery of this water and wine may we come to share in the divinity of Christ who humbled himself to share in our humanity."

The wine mixed with water symbolizes not only the water and blood which flowed from Christ's side, but also the two natures of Christ: human and divine. When the priest mixes the two substances, just as Christ was wholly human and wholly divine, we pray that we as His Church might be made like Him in His divinity, even as He made Himself like us in our humanity.

It was at Eastern that I began to fall in love with Jesus Christ and His Church and started to actively discern a call to Priesthood. After grad school, I attended



Saint Meinrad Seminary & School of Theology in St. Meinrad, IN. I was ordained in 2022, spent my first two years in Quincy, spent a year at St. Agnes, and am now working in Vocations. I look forward to getting to know as many of you as possible. God bless you!




