FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Respect Life Month

As perhaps you know, the Catholic Church in the United States celebrates *Respect Life Month* in October, and in fact this Sunday—the first Sunday in October—is designated as *Respect Life Sunday*. As such, our prayer this month is especially focused on praying for a culture that respects life in all its forms, from conception to natural death. To quote the statement from the USCCB for this year's *Respect Life Month*, "the daily headlines remind us of how desperately our world is thirsting for the hope that only God can provide. Every day we witness the overwhelming disregard for human life: through risings rates of abortion and assisted suicide; the killing of innocent school children, even at prayer; the mistreatment of our immigrant sisters and brothers as they endure an environment of aggression; and political and ideological violence inflicted against unsuspecting victims. These attacks threaten life precisely when it is most vulnerable and in need of protection."

No doubt, our culture needs some transformation (call it "conversion") around the big issues of protecting and respecting human life. Let's commit or recommit ourselves to being agents of prayer, healing, and hope in the midst of an ailing culture, so marred by violence and undue aggression, and stand for a true culture of life.

I ran across the following reflection some years ago in a book called *The Reed of God*, written by a British Catholic author by the name of Caryll Houselander. It's a powerful testimony of how Jesus desires to be with us, even in the less glorious parts of our human plight:

"It must have been a season of joy, and she [Mary] must have longed for his birth, but at the same time she knew that every step she took, took her little son nearer to the grave.

Each work of her hands prepared His hands a little more for the nails; each breath that she drew counted one more to His last.

In giving life to Him she was giving Him death.

All other children born must inevitably die; death belongs to fallen nature; mother's gift to the child is life.

But Christ is life; death did not belong to Him.

In fact, unless Mary would give Him death, He could not die.

Unless she would give Him the capacity for suffering, He could not suffer.

He could only feel cold and hunger and thirst if she gave Him her vulnerability to cold and hunger and thirst.

He could not know the indifference of friends or treachery or the bitterness of being betrayed unless she gave Him a human mind and a human heart.

That is what it meant to Mary to give human nature to God.

He was vulnerable; He asked for her body to be wounded.

He was joy itself; He asked her to give Him tears.

He was God; He asked her to make Him man.

He asked for hands and feet to be nailed.

He asked for flesh to be scourged.

He asked for blood to be shed.

He asked for a heart to be broken.

The stable at Bethlehem was the first Calvary.

The wooden manger was the first Cross.

The swaddling bands were the first burial bands.

The Passion had begun.

Christ was man."


