

#### FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

#### **World Mission Sunday**

This Sunday, the Church celebrates "World Mission Sunday" as a way to unite Catholics around the world in support of the missionary work of the Church. Established by Pope Pius XI in 1926 and celebrated every year on the second-to-last Sunday of October, it is a reminder of the call that each of us has to participate in the missionary work of the Church, whether that be by direct preaching of the Gospel in the world, by the witness of our lives in living the spiritual and corporal works of mercy, or by our prayer, fasting, and almsgiving.

The Second Vatican Council, in the Decree on the Mission Activity of the Church entitled *Ad Gentes*, proclaimed that the Church is "missionary by her very nature." Furthermore, it stressed that the missionary work that lies at the heart of the Church is entrusted to *every baptized individual*, not just to the clergy or consecrated religious or some otherwise specialized group of individuals. In fact, this was one of the great emphases of the Second Vatican Council: to insist that the "call" of the Church and the "work" of the Church belonged to *all the faithful*, just as the path to holiness was open to all. In fact, the Second Vatican Council was emphatic that it is **primarily the role of the laity** to engage and transform the temporal sphere by engaging with the world and bringing the Gospel to the social, cultural, political, and economic realms. So in short: it's by the way that every lay person lives and proclaims the Gospel in their everyday lives, families, and workplaces that the Christian message is allowed to spread through the world.

So World Mission Sunday is not just a celebration of all that is happening "out there," as if the mission territories are the only places where the Church is called to spread the Gospel. It is a call to each of us to *ensure that we are doing our part from right where we are.* And yes, in a special way, we are called to support the work of the Church by our prayer and generosity as she spreads the Gospel in other parts of the world where Christ is not known; but that "mission territory" might not be nearly as far away as we think it is.

The money collected especially for World Mission Sunday (i.e. donated online or placed in the envelope with that designation) goes to support the work of the Pontifical Mission Societies, ultimately helping to build churches and schools, educate seminarians and catechists, and provide healthcare and pastoral care in the 1,124 mission territories overseen by the Holy See. (Fun fact: Archbishop Fulton J. Sheen used to be the National Director of the Society of the Propagation of the Faith—basically the head of the Pontifical Mission Society in the US—and often said that the Church in the United States would never have grown so quickly without the support of this collection: between 1822 and 1908, American dioceses received the equivalent of \$250 million to build parishes, schools, and seminaries!) Nowadays, the money collected on this day from every parish, in every diocese, in every country around the world is the only annual global collection to support this work.

So consider today your contribution, not just financial, but also by your prayer and by your witness: how are you being called to participate more directly in the missionary work of the Church today?

Keep spreading joy!
