FATHER TIM'S *pastor's corner*

Last week in the Pastor's Corner I wrote about Mass intentions in general, how we are all encouraged to bring a special intention in our hearts to each Mass and that the priest celebrating Mass has a specific intention for every Mass which the people of the parish may request with

an offering. This week I would like to discuss why we have Masses said for our loved ones who have died.

The most fundamental and ancient function of the priesthood is to offer a sacrifice to God. In performing this function the priest stands between God and man as a mediator and on behalf of someone or some group he offers a gift to God. Obviously, this isn't for God's benefit, but for our benefit as it teaches us that all we have belongs to God. In our Catholic faith we believe that every Mass is a "re-presentation" of the one final sacrifice made for us on the Cross by Christ. In other words, the sacrifice of Calvary is again made present to God on the altar every time a Catholic priest says Mass, acting in the person of Christ, who was both the priest offering the sacrifice and the victim offered to God. When we go to Mass we are participating in this act of love. When we have a Mass "said" for someone we are applying that sacrificial offering for someone else.

I am often asked, when we have a Mass said for a dead person, what does it do for them? After all, if they are already in heaven, they don't need the healing effects of God's grace for their sins. The answer is not something that we often talk

about in the Church these days: Purgatory. I believe that we don't mention Purgatory as much as we used to in the Church because of the misconception that it is a terrible or frightening place, but the opposite is true. Purgatory is the place where we are healed from the effects or scars of our sins. Purgatory prepares us for the endless joys of heaven so that nothing stands in the way of us fully participating in God's presence. We can do a lot of this work in this life by offering up our daily sufferings and trials to unite ourselves to Christ on the Cross but for many if not most of us, this work of reparation and healing is not finished before we die. God's mercy allows it to continue to completion even after death. This is our doctrine of Purgatory which we still believe as a Church and have never stopped believing.

There is much, much more that can be said about these things. But it is important to remember that one of the most profound and beautiful acts that we can do for a loved one when they die is to have Masses said for them. It is not that we believe that they aren't worthy of heaven, rather, it is our way of offering our prayers and God's grace to them to give them aid and comfort during the time of purification which we will all go through on our way to paradise because none of us are perfect. It pleases God to allow us to participate in His work of our redemption and it reminds us of the strong connection we still have with the dead. It does not matter if it is a daily Mass or a Sunday Mass, and you can request as many Masses as you would like. There is simply no greater prayer and no greater gift than the Mass because there is nothing greater than the sacrifice and resurrection of the Christ.

Greetings Parents!

It is time for our catechetical year to begin and registration for the following programs has begun. Registration will also be available at the Parish Center as well as the first day of class and online this year.

Children's Catechesis: Our first class is Sunday, August 11th. Ages 3 yrs - K meet at 9:30 am and grades 1st-8th meet at 10:30 am. All classes meet in the Parish Center. Tuition for 1 Child= \$60.00; 2 Children= \$100.00; 3 or more Children= \$120.00. Payment is due with the registration form.

First Sacramental Preparation (Reconciliation & Eucharist):

Our Orientation meeting is Sunday, August 18th, from 1:30-3pm. We will begin in Schafer Hall. If your child was NOT baptized at St. Mark, a baptismal certificate must be submitted by September 16, 2019. If your child is already 7 years old and has not received the Sacrament of Baptism, they must be prepared through the RCIA program. Tuition is \$40 per child or \$60 for two or more children.

Centered on fostering a deep relationship with Jesus and the Church he founded, this journey takes place in distinct stages beginning in early fall and building toward Holy Week and the Easter Season. 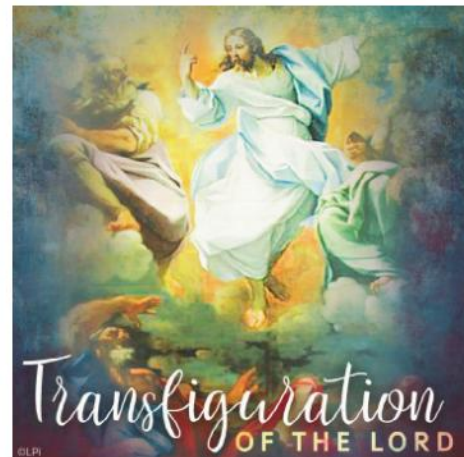
