



Hello Everyone,

As we begin Lent, I want to briefly reflect on the three great spiritual practices our Church recommends for us during this season of preparation: Prayer, Fasting, and Almsgiving.

It should be no surprise that we are encouraged to renew ourselves in prayer during Lent. The practice of speaking to God,

bringing him our needs, thanking him for our gifts, and worshiping Him as our creator is the most fundamental practice we have as Catholics to strengthen and develop our relationship with the Holy Trinity. All of us need to take time each year to recommit ourselves to some act of private daily prayer. When that takes place in our day and the form in which it takes will be different for each of us, but Lent is the perfect season to take stock of our prayer life and pledge to strengthen it.

Fasting, or acts of penance, is an ancient and very powerful way that we can prepare ourselves for Easter. This can take many forms, but the two most common are "giving up something for Lent" and of course abstaining from meat on Fridays. The principle at work here is that we voluntarily give up things which we enjoy in order to reorient ourselves towards Christ. Fasting from something teaches us that Christ is the most important thing that we can have in this life and anything else which might not be bad in and of itself, must be properly prioritized so that we do not allow the things of this world to come between us and our Savior.

Fasting also trains our will so that our appetite does not always get what it wants. In this way, fasting is a powerful antidote for habitual sins, especially sins of the body that we can't seem to shake. By fasting and voluntarily abstaining from things we desire, we grow in self-control and self-mastery. Lent gives us an opportunity each year to engage in this spiritual training so that by Easter we have grown as a result.

Finally, Lent calls us to grow in our practice of almsgiving (acts of charity). There is no better way to appreciate the material gifts that God has blessed us with than to use those gifts to bless others in return. Giving of our treasure, time, and talent to help those less fortunate is at the very foundation of how to interact with the material world. Like prayer and fasting, this season calls us to recommit ourselves in this endeavor.

While Lent is obviously not the only time that we are called to pray, fast, and charitably give, it is a wonderful opportunity each year for us to assess how we are faring in these most basic Christian practices. As human beings, we are not done growing in these three areas until we leave this life for the next. So let us come through Lent 2020 having grown in all three of these great practices. After all, there is no better way to prepare for the celebration of the Resurrection of the Lord!







### Scouting News

On February 17th, the national organization of the Boy Scouts of America (BSA) filed for Chapter 11 bankruptcy to achieve two key objectives: equitably compensate victims who were harmed during their time in Scouting and continue to carry out Scouting's mission for years to come. The reason for this action is increasing financial pressure on the BSA from litigation involving past abuse in Scouting. The plan is to create a Trust that would provide equitable compensation to these individuals.

It is important to know that Scouting programs will continue with regular unit meetings, activities, and service projects. As we go through this process, we want to make certain that all Scouting parents and volunteers know the following:

Scouting is safer now than ever before. Approximately 90% of the pending and asserted claims against the BSA relate to abuse that occurred more than 30 years ago. The safety of children in our programs is our absolute top priority and that one instance of abuse is one too many. We are outraged that there have been times when individuals took advantage of our programs to abuse innocent children. Over many years, BSA responded by developing some of the strongest expert-informed youth protection policies found in any youth-serving organization. In addition, Catholic chartered units require all adults to receive Safe and Sacred training and a separate background check.

From mandatory youth protection training and background checks for all volunteers and staff to policies that prohibit one-

on-one interaction between youth and adults and require that any suspected abuse is reported to law enforcement. Our volunteers take youth protection extremely seriously and do their part to help keep kids safe. You can read more about the BSA's multi-layered safeguards and our efforts to be part of the broader solution to child abuse at www.scouting.org/youth-safety. In fact, this is a resource that you can share with friends and family who are interested in understanding what the BSA is doing to keep kids safe.

- Scouting continues. Scouting programs will continue to serve youth, families, and local communities throughout this process and for many years to come. Parents agree that Scouting values mirror those of our faith and continue to be invaluable to our future leaders.
- Local councils have not filed for bankruptcy. Local councils which provide programming, financial, facility, and
  administrative support to Scouting units in their communities are legally separate, distinct, and financially independent from
  the national organization.
