
Hello Everyone,


This Sunday we celebrate Laetare Sunday, the fourth Sunday of Lent in which the liturgical color is traditionally rose (i.e., pink). Laetare literally means, "rejoice," it's in the imperative form, like a command. We are urged by our Church to rejoice on this Sunday, as we get ever closer to celebrating the Paschal Mystery of our Lord.

While Laetare Sunday, and its counterpart on the 3trd Sunday of Advent, Gaudete Sunday, are rare occurrences in each Liturgical year (the color rose is only worn on these two days), it is important to remember that they are chances for us to be reminded that we are called to be joyful and rejoice as much as possible! Not in a way that is fake or forced, but in a way that acknowledges the inalienable truth of God's love for us! This isn't to say that we do not lament the evil in the world, or mourn loss and hardship. But this is always overcome by joy in the end. The evil never has the last word, and death and loss are but temporary realities that will one day give way to eternal happiness. One of the great things about joy, especially when it radiates from us, is that it is by far the most effective form of evangelization that we could possibly do. That is because joy is universally desired, and almost always recognized. When people see joy, they want to find its source, and we in the Catholic Church know what that source is.

So, let us heed the command of the prophet in Isaiah 66:10, "Rejoice [Laetare] with Jerusalem and be glad for her, all you who love her!" The Church is our new Jerusalem, and in her we always rejoice with joy.

SAFE PARISH -SAFE ENVIRONMENT TRAINING

On July 1, 2021, Safe Parish replaced Safe and Sacred as the child protection program for the Archdiocese of Indianapolis. The Safe Parish program was chosen to provide easier access to child protection training for clergy, employees, and volunteers. It allows us to broaden the focus of the training to increase awareness of all forms of child abuse. Safe Parish includes an assessment that must be taken and passed to ensure that training content is learned and can be applied. We believe these are important new features for this program.

• Who Should Complete This Training?


Safe Parish Training is a requirement for all volunteers regardless of their ministry area. If you are 18 years of age or older and you volunteer in any ministries here at St. Mark, you must comply with all the requirements. All employees and all volunteers dealing with children must complete all three sections BEFORE starting any position.

• How Do I Access Training?


Visit www.archindysafeparish. org to register for an account. The online training takes about 45 minutes to complete along with a BACKGROUND CHECK and a CODE of CONDUCT statement. Once the initial training is complete, quarterly bulletins will be sent to your email much like the older VIRTUS training. Questions regarding training can be submitted through the SUPPORT option in the menu on the training site.

• How Often Will I Need to Complete this Training? Training will expire every five years. At this time, most everyone's Safe and Sacred is set to expire in 2022 so the expectation is to go ahead and complete Safe Parish training this year prior to volunteering in any ministries.

Our Lady of FATIMA




