Hello Everyone!

We are finally able to give you a substantial update on the capital campaign and building project. Last week, we received the final approval of the Archdiocese to move forward with the project! The Archdiocese will underwrite our bridge loan to complete the project, and we will pay them back upon the collection of the pledges. This has been a long journey and an incredibly complicated process to get to this point. I cannot thank you all enough for your generosity that contributed to the success of the Growing in the Good News campaign so far. I also want to thank our Campaign and Continuation Committees for all the hard work and time that has gone in to keeping us on track!

You have probably noticed by now the site work going on in the field between the school and the cenacle. This is where our temporary classroom and offices are going to go. The parish center will move there as soon as we are able. The first thing you will see happen on the new construction will be the demolition of the old parish center (originally the convent). Once that is down, and the basement hole is filled in, we will be ready to start the site work and foundation work on the new construction! Before that begins, we will have a ground breaking ceremony this June. You can check out a picture in the narthex of the last

ground breaking ceremony we had here at St. Mark, when we built the current church from exactly 30 years ago, in June of 1992!

Along with this exciting news that we are moving forward as planned with the construction project, I also have to acknowledge the challenges that still lay ahead. There is still about 3 million dollars of pledges to collect, and your vigilance and continued generosity on this is so greatly appreciated! Along with this, we have been hit very hard with the rising cost of construction materials, labor, and inflation. From the original concept renderings and estimates to now, the cost of this project has gone up almost 2 millions dollars, with no change in scope! This is a very serious challenge, and we have placed a lot of trust in God to guide us through this situation. We are able to move forward because of the success of the campaign so far, and because we are confident that our parishioners will continue to bless our parish to see this project through.

Your continued support of the normal weekly collection, and the campaign, is appreciated more than I can put into words. Your love of this parish constantly amazes me, and anything more anyone can do extra for this campaign, including our newest parishioners who have not yet had a chance to join the effort yet, will ensure we will finish this project without substantial debt to the Archdiocese. My trust in God, and his work through you for our parish has never been stronger. Now let's take St. Mark to the next 50 years of success, and literally watch this parish grow and thrive!

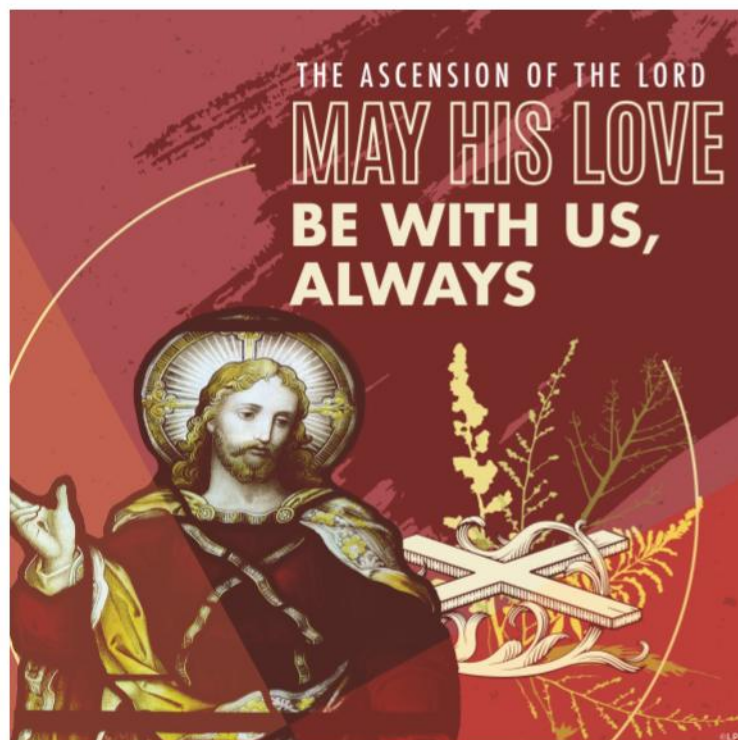

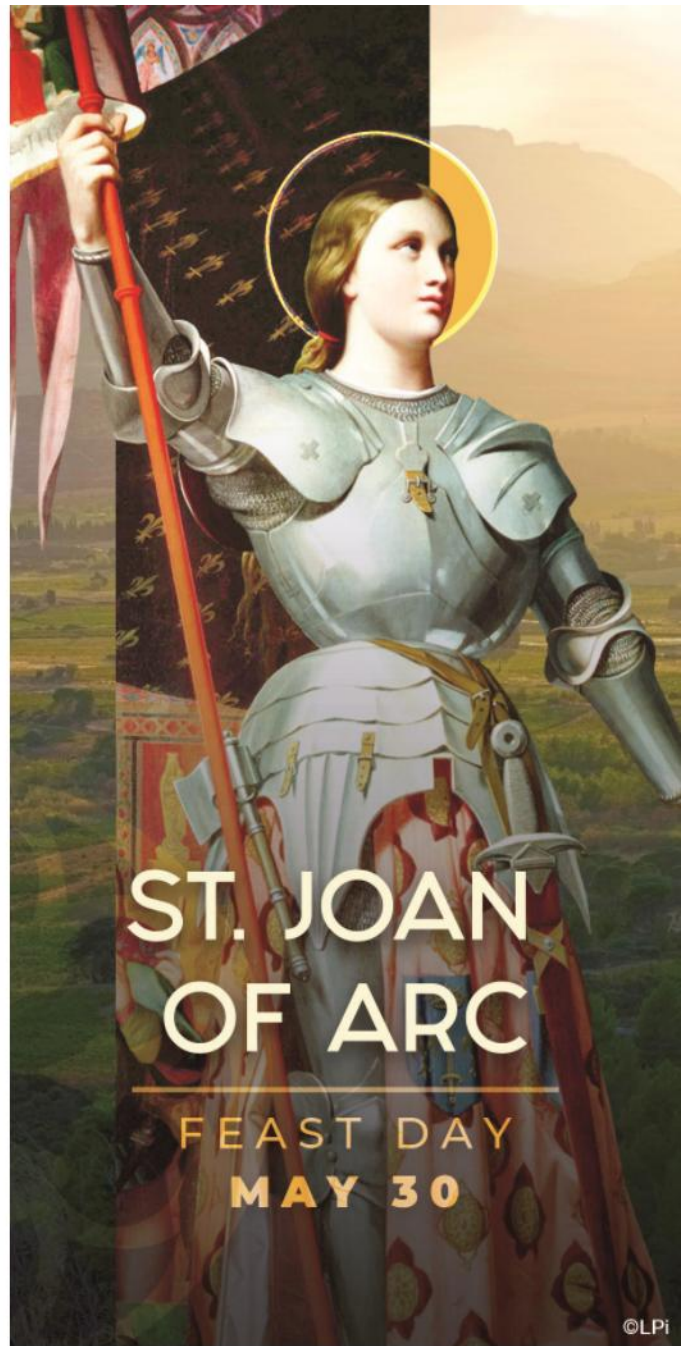

St. Joan of Arc | May 30

St. Joan of Arc (1412 – 1431) has had her story told throughout history through many books, movies and plays. She was born in the village of Domrémy, near the province of Lorraine, to a French peasant family. At a young age, she began to experience visions and voices, which were later identified to be of St. Michael, St. Catherine of Alexandria, and St. Margaret of Antioch. At the age of 13, all three saints told her that she was to drive the English from French territory, and that she must bring the Dauphin to Reims for his coronation. Trusting in God, she did as she was told.

During the Hundred Years War, St. Joan of Arc led French troops against the English and recaptured the cities of Orléans and Troyes. Captured near Compiègne the following year, she was sold to the English and placed on trial for heresy and witchcraft, eventually being found guilty and burned at the stake in Rouen.

St. Joan of Arc was canonized by Pope Benedict XV on May 16, 1920, and is the patron saint of military members.

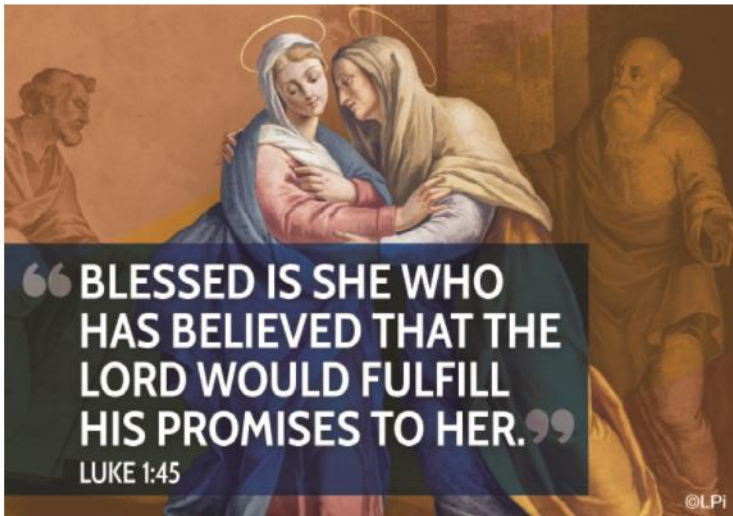
