### Policy Regarding Firearms at St. Mark Catholic Church



Outside my window where I sit in silence for my morning and afternoon prayers, there is a little bush, not so big, full of green leaves in spring and summer. It produces flowers in beautiful hues of red and pink. Over the summer, I've noticed how each one of those blossoms awakens each morning and turns its face toward the sun.

The sun is the source of their energy and their life. As morning turns into day, they move gracefully and ever so slightly in the direction of the sun, always in pursuit of its life giving rays. I often ponder the beauty of God's creation as I gaze in wonder at one of those blossoms, his creative energy informing and suffusing its essential nature.

Could this be what Jesus had in mind when he said that we should "notice how the flowers grow?" (cf Luke 12:27) He places this advice in the context of relieving us from our worries and anxiety. Can any of you by worrying add a moment to your lifespan, Jesus asks us. And so he invites us into a place of rest by noticing the beauty all around us.

The flowers do not toil or spin, he says, but by their very existence manifest the splendor of God's glory. How often do we find that our lives are full of "toiling and spinning?" Yet, God had elevated us to his own image and likeness, the true essence of our being. Thus, simply by virtue of our existence, our breathing, the beating of our hearts, we manifest in our bodies the glory and splendor of our Creator.

What might we learn from Jesus's counsel to "notice the flowers?" In the same way that each blossom turns its face toward the source of its

life, we too are invited to humbly turn our face toward God each day, the creative Source of our lives. Jesus is imparting spiritual wisdom, assuring us that we don't have to do anything to enter into the Divine Life he desires to share with us. All we need to do is to simply be what we were created to be. (cf Ephesians 1:5,11-12) When we rest awhile from all our "toiling and spinning," even for just a few minutes, we begin to sense God's presence in that moment.

Jesus's counsel to 'Consider the lilies, how they grow,' is part of a larger sermon about trust and surrender, about acknowledging our complete and total dependence on God. Don't worry, and don't be afraid, he says. Seek first the Kingdom of God, the ultimate goal of our lives.

And so, dear sisters and brothers, may each one of us gently turn our face toward the God who made us out of love, for love for himself alone: the Father, Creator of all that is, the Son, our liberator, redeemer, brother and friend, and their Indwelling Spirit, who gives and sustains our lives.

May the peace of Christ, the peace which the world cannot give, dwell within your hearts now and forever.

## GOSPEL MEDITATION

26th Sunday in Ordinary Time

"If they will not listen to Moses and the prophets, neither will they be persuaded if someone should rise from the dead." Regardless of how the message of faith is received, a total conversion of mind and heart is needed for it to take root and have meaning. It is easy to become complacent and comfortable with all that life can afford us. Life can become "all about me," preserving my livelihood and protecting my securities. Often, this drive can become so strong that we eagerly strive to protect our self-interests at the expense of others. Other people are necessary only to the extent that they are "useful" to us and profitable.

Merriam-Webster defines entitlement as "the belief that one is deserving of or entitled to certain privileges." In a world that pretends to offer us so many necessities, this is perhaps the greatest contemporary sin. When we feel "entitled" to something, even if it is perceived necessary, our relationships can get skewed. Unless we adopt a global vision of entitlement wherein everyone is entitled to the same things, we risk becoming extremely self-focused and selfish. All we care about is defending our rights and protecting our turf. This impulse can be so strong that we pursue it even at the expense of another. Is this what God intends for his children?

Holding on to this myopic vision, the plight and station of others are off our radar and of no real concern to us. Relying on our own merits and becoming resilient to life's challenges, we replace the true and real God with the one we created ourselves. Jesus and the prophets before him have consistently reminded us of the dangers of wealth, ignoring the poor and the needy, and becoming too fiercely independent and arrogant. Yet, we conduct our lives as if that message has never been preached. We give our faith a nod and never consider for a moment that we may be wrong in terms of what we see as important. "The things that we love tell us what we are (attributed to St. Thomas Aquinas)." Ponder those words a bit and remember that when we leave this world and go to the next one, what we loved here is what we will look for there. What we sought here may not be there.

## VISITING MISSIONARY

This weekend we are welcoming Fr. George Knab, OMI to St. Mark!

*"To spread the joy of the Gospel, Pope Francis wants believers to double-down the practice of the corporal and spiritual works of mercy. Within a faith community, I find joy in preaching a Gospel message that promotes sponsorship as a sign of divine mercy to the children of the poor. I cherish the opportunities Unbound is giving me to proclaim joyfully that sponsorship is a concrete sign of God's mercy."*



Father George Knab is a Missionary Oblate of Mary Immaculate living in Belleville, Illinois. Pope Francis has renewed Fr. Knab's designation as a Missionary of Mercy — along with 895 others globally — in order that each may be a "Joyful proclaimer of divine mercy and its faithful dispenser." Previously serving as director of religious services at a Buffalo, New York, Catholic high school, hospital chaplain in Indianapolis and pastor in South Carolina and Florida, he promoted outreach to poor communities in the developing world. Currently he conducts Bible studies at a soup kitchen and his parish mission collections now support Oblate seminarians in Zambia. Father Knab has written a booklet of bedside Eucharistic devotions.



## ROSARY

St. Mark The Evangelist Catholic Church Catholic Church


**The Rosary begins 22 minutes before the 7:00 AM Sunday Mass.**

A Plenary Indulgence may be gained under the usual conditions when the Rosary is prayed in Church, in a family group or in a religious community.

Also, Five (5) decades of the Rosary must be prayed continuously. The prayers of the Rosary must be prayed vocally and one must meditate upon the Mysteries of the Rosary. If the recitation of the Rosary is public, the Mysteries of the Rosary must be announced.

A Plenary Indulgence may be gained only once per day except by those who are in danger of death. To gain a plenary indulgence one must perform the indulgent act. Three other conditions must be fulfilled:

1. A sacramental confession.
2. Eucharistic Communion
3. Prayers for the Pope's intention.



If this complete integrity is not present or if the above conditions are not fulfilled the indulgence is only partial. Both a plenary and partial indulgence may be applied to the dead.

A plenary indulgence is particularly powerful way to obtain remission of punishment, on earth or in purgatory, that would have resulted from sins that were already forgiven. It covers all sins, mortal or venial, that the recipient has committed up to that time, if the person sincerely repents, detests their sins and fulfills all requirements of the indulgence.

A Partial Indulgence can be gained by the Rosary recitation in whole or in part in other circumstances.


## ST. MARK YOUTH MINISTRY


