St. Mark the Evangelist Catholic Church

Did you know that the Church dedicates each month of the year to a particular devotion? For instance, November is dedicated to the Poor Souls in Purgatory and we are called to spend the month of November praying and gaining indulgences for the souls of the faithful departed. June is dedicated to the Sacred Heart of Jesus, in which we contemplate in a particular way the love of Christ for His Church.

The month of July is dedicated to the Precious Blood of Jesus. I have a particular devotion to the Precious Blood of Our Lord, so I want to take a few moments to reflect on this devotion as we are in the midst of the month of July.

The Feast of the Precious Blood of Jesus was established by Pope Pius IX in 1849 to be celebrated on July 1. Even though the Feast was established for the Universal Church at a relatively late time, devotion to the Precious Blood goes back to the Early Church. The Fathers of the Church taught that the Church Herself was born through the Blood of Christ on the Cross; when the soldier pierced the side of Christ with the lance, Blood and Water gushed forth. And it was from this Blood and Water that the Church Herself was born—She who is the dispenser of the Blood of

Redemption, the dispenser of the stream of sacramental grace poured out on us unceasingly by Our Most Loving Lord. It was from the Blood of Christ that the Church came forth.

Each time we receive Holy Communion, we partake in the Precious Blood of Christ (even if we only receive the Sacred Host, we know that in every single piece of the host—even the smallest particle!—the Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity of Christ is truly present). Through Holy Communion, we receive, as it were, a blood transfusion: Christ's blood pumps through our veins. Through Christ's Precious Blood, we are divinized and made partakers in His very divinity. This is the prayer that the deacon prays when he mixes a drop of water into the wine at the Offertory: "By the mystery of this water and wine may we come to share in the Divinity of Christ who humbled Himself to share in our humanity."

In this month of the Precious Blood, let us contemplate in a particular way what it means to be divinized through the Blood of Christ. Through Holy Communion the very Blood of Christ pumps through our veins—how can we reflect this, by His Grace, in our own lives? How can we live and love more like Christ in the world?
