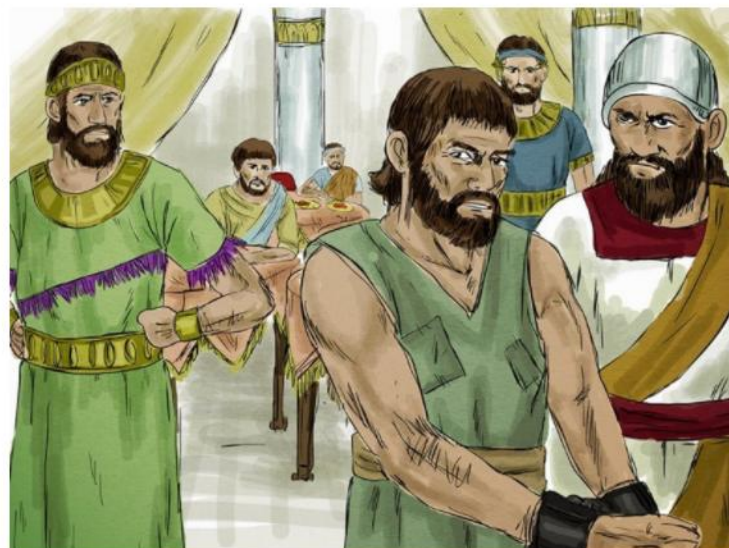
DEACONS' CORNER: 15 October 2023
(Mathew 22:1-14, Invitation to the Wedding Feast)

Our Scripture readings for this Sunday begin with great encouragement! Isaiah tells us that “...*the Lord of Hosts will provide for all peoples a feast of rich food and choice wines...He will destroy death forever. The Lord God will wipe away the tears from every face; the reproach (guilt or condemnation) of His people He will remove from the whole earth...*” Doesn’t that sound like a fantastic deal for us, ALL of us? God will take care of everything! Paul even tells the Philippians in our second reading, that his “...*God will fully supply whatever you need, in accordance with His glorious riches in Christ Jesus...*”

The Psalm reading talks about living “...*in the house of the Lord all the days of my life... I shall not want (for anything) ...He (the Lord) refreshes my soul... (He) spreads the table before me...*” Again, aren’t these very comforting things to hear? The world out there can be very trying, very discouraging, sometimes even soul-crushing! But our God stretches out His hand to lead us and protect us and invites us into his Presence. We may not realize it, but even on our worst days He is there walking the journey with us. He wants to guide us down the proper paths that lead us to eternity with Him, but we can be a stubborn and recalcitrant people just like the Jewish leaders of Jesus’ time.

The Gospel recounts Jesus’ parable about a king and a wedding feast for the king’s son which he (Jesus) uses to teach that the Kingdom of God is actually open to everyone, and not solely to the Jewish people alone. The king sends his servants to gather the invited guests, but they decline to come! That must have been an eye-opener! Who doesn’t want to attend a feast at the king’s place? Would you decline an invitation to the White House for a celebratory dinner and festivities for the President’s son? Most people would be very honored to have been extended an invitation, and probably would have dressed up for it, too!

The king sent his servants out again to encourage the guests to come, but the guests roughed up the servants and killed some of them. The king’s response was swift and harsh: he had the offending guests “...*destroyed...*” and their city burned. (In the parable, these original guests are stand-ins for the Jewish leaders of Jesus’ time who were plotting against Jesus. They believed they were God’s only “chosen” people!) The guests who were invited afterwards are us, the Gentiles who were more accepting of Jesus and his teachings.



But one of these new guests was “...*a man there not dressed in (appropriate) wedding garments...*” Everyone else spruced themselves up a bit to attend the wedding feast, even if the garments may have been provided by the King. The common consensus is that this man is representative of someone who was not quite prepared for a complete commitment to Jesus, and he gets bound up and thrown out into the darkness to perish.

The King in the parable is really God, and He loves us and continues seeking us out. The invitation to God’s Kingdom “banquet” is always and forever open to everyone. We don’t earn this privilege through our own actions or good deeds – it’s a gift! The parable challenges us: have we just shown up? Or have we truly accepted God’s personal invitation into relationship with Him? If so, that implies a willingness to develop intimacy with God. You don’t achieve intimacy with someone just by your presence, and the same applies to your relationship with God. You must be willing to share yourself through spending time together, through Scripture reading and prayer, through seeking out God’s will for your life, through sharing His love and concern for our brothers and sisters and for God’s Creation. So, continue to accept God’s invitation, and put on the robes of salvation! Heaven will be a big feast for all of us!

Bible Study of Exodus

The Exodus is the central event of the Old Testament, giving meaning to everything else we find in its pages.
