Baptism, Confirmation, and Holy Orders confers and indelible mark on the soul, Reconciliation restores the sanctifying grace necessary for salvation when we discard it through mortal sins. Anointing gives us a special grace of spiritual strength when we are physically weakened.

Matrimony confers a sacramental bond that cannot be broken except by death. And the Eucharist gives us the grace of receiving Christ into our very soul. No sacramental practices achieves this level of grace, but by practicing sacramentals, grace is nonetheless given to us, and when it comes to grace, we need as much as we can get!

From May to July 2024, we will carry the Blessed Sacrament through the streets of our nation in the first-ever

National Eucharistic Pilgrimage. We will accompany Jesus publicly as he travels thousands of miles on his way to the 10th National Eucharistic Congress, which will take place in Indianapolis from July 17–21, 2024. This national Pilgrimage will create priceless opportunities for everyone—Catholics and non-Catholics, alike—to encounter Christ personally on the road, just as they did 2,000 years ago. And YOU are invited to be a pilgrim!

Join the Eucharistic Caravan. These are pilgrims who meet up with the Pilgrimage and walk with us for any portion of the four routes—the Marian route, the Seton route, the Juan Diego route, or the Serra route. Here are the details:

- Helpline volunteers cover two or more 2-hour shifts monthly.
