## Pastor's Reflection

The Transitus of St.
Francis is traditionally celebrated by
Franciscans all over the world on October
3rd. This is the vigil of the Feast of St. Francis and is a night to



commemorate the death of our beloved Saint. Transitus is a Latin word that means passage or crossing over. In every account written on the death of St. Francis, it is remembered that he crossed over from life on earth to eternal life with the Lord, full of great joy and song.

We will celebrate the Transitus at 5:00 pm Mass on Saturday.

Here are some ways to honor St. Francis and take part in the Transitus in your own home:

- Meditate on some of the writings and prayers of St. Francis. Pray for peace in our world!
- St. Francis is the patron saint of animals and ecology.
   Spend some time picking up trash and cleaning up your neighborhood.

3) Read the story of the death of St. Francis: "On the eve of his death, the saint, in imitation of his Divine Master, had bread brought to him and broken. This he distributed among those present, blessing Bernard of Quintaville, his first companion, Elias, his vicar, and all the others in order. "I have done my part," he said next, "may Christ teach you to do yours." Then wishing to give a last token of detachment and to show he no longer had anything in common with the world, Francis removed his poor habit and lay down on the bare ground, covered with a borrowed cloth, rejoicing that he was able to keep faith with his Lady Poverty to the end. After a while he asked to have read to him the Passion according to St. John, and then in faltering tones he himself intoned Psalm exli. At the concluding verse, 'Bring my soul out of prison'. Francis was led away from earth by 'Sister Death', in whose praise he had shortly before added a new strophe to his 'Canticle of the Sun'."

# SAINT OF THE WEEK SAINT CHARLES HOUBEN

Charles was born Joannes Andreas Houben on December 11, 1821 in the village of Munstergeleen in the Kingdom of the Netherlands, to Peter Joseph Houben and his wife, Johanna Elizabeth Luyten. One of 11 children in a poor family, he was a slow learner in his youth. To those outside his family he seemed quiet and extremely



When Charles was 19 years old he was enrolled for military service in the First Infantry Regiment of the Netherlands. On February 18, 1845 his period as a reservist in the army came to an end and he was formally discharged.

Feeling called to religious life, in 1845 Charles was admitted to the novitiate of the Passionists, who had recently arrived in Belgium, in the village of Ere, near Tournai. He professed his religious vows the following year and was given the religious habit and the religious name of Charles of St. Andrew. His father died in 1850, just before Charles' ordination as a priest which occurred on December 21, 1850.

He was appointed to the Passionists' new English foundation in 1852. In July 1857, Charles was transferred to Ireland to the newly founded monastery of Mount Argus, in Harold's Cross, Dublin.

Charles was not a good preacher. He never really mastered the English language, but it was in the confessional and in comforting the sick that he excelled, and he became fond of the Irish people. Following the example of Blessed Dominic Barbieri, an apostle of Ecumenism, Charles worked hard for the good of souls and the unity of the Church. It was Charles' gift of healing the sick which is most clearly remembered.

Charles was transferred back to England in 1866 and remained there for eight years.

Charles returned to Dublin in 1874. A wagon in which he was travelling overturned near St Clare's Convent at Harold's Cross, causing a fracture which never set right. He remained in Dublin until his death on January 5, 1893

Charles was beatified by Pope John Paul II on October 16, 1988 and canonized by Pope Benedict XVI on June 3, 2007. The Feast Day of Saint Charles Houben is January 5.
