


The Way of the Cross





A LITTLE BIT OF HISTORY... CONTINUED Written by Dr. Jessica Dello Russo

As a way to further emphasize the church's important role in spiritual formation, the upper church was redecorated for the parish's Diamond Jubilee year of 1948. The ecclesiastical art studio of Antonio D'Ambrosio repainted many of the older figural scenes, such as the four evangelists in the spandrels of the dome and the series of notable Franciscan saints and other great leaders in church history in the upper register of the semi -circular wall of the apse. D'Amboiso also added a series of paintings honoring the Virgin Mary, notably the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin in the semi-dome of the apse and Mysteries of the Rosary in the alcoves of the side aisles, along with depictions of the heraldic symbols of the Franciscan order and of Richard Cardinal Cushing.



Also during the parish's Diamon Jubilee year of 1948, the opportunity grose to purchase an adjacent lot on the corner of Hanover and Prince Streets. After some years, the site was transformed completely in 1956 into a "peace garden' populated by marble statues of Jesus, Mary, St. Francis, and the shrine at Fatima, together with the more recent addition of a bronze statue of the Capuchin Saint Pio di Pietrelcina; another work in bronze of St. Leonard framed by the Stations of the Cross, created by Richard Aliberti, was mounted beside the Prince Street entrance to the church in 1996. A colossal, gilded plague of the San Damiano Cross mounted upon the side wall of the rectory helps to frame the clearing as a place of peace and prayer. The Peace Garden was reconfigured in 2009, and over the following decade until 2017 an extensive building restoration enhanced the church's accessibility by the addition of a ramp, elevator, resurfaced flooring, new seating configuration, and ADA-compliant restroom, along with a reconfigured of the altar and baptismal font and transformation of the former St. Anthony Shrine into St. Joseph's Hall. Saint Leonards' as you see it today, was reopened on December 17. 2017. To be continued...


