Christ is the Antidote



In speaking about the importance of the Ascension and Jesus' gift of the Holy Spirit, Pope Benedict XVI wrote that not only is "the Holy Spirit...the power through which Christ causes us to experience his closeness" but empowers us to be

witnesses. He stated "The Risen Christ needs witnesses who have met him, people who have known him intimately through the power of the Holy Spirit; those who have, so to speak, actually touched him, can witness to him."

He continued "It is in this way that the Church, the family of Christ, "beginning at Jerusalem"..., as the Reading says, spread to the very ends of the earth. It is through witnesses that the Church was built - starting with Peter and Paul and the Twelve, to the point of including all who, filled with Christ, have rekindled down the centuries and will rekindle the flame of faith in a way that is ever new. All Christians in their own way can and must be witnesses of the Risen Lord. When we read the saints' names we can see how often they have been - and continue to be - first and foremost simple people from whom shone - and shines - a radiant light that can lead others to Christ.

We are therefore called to witness to the truth of the good news by authentically living out the teachings of Christ and putting our faith into practice. Only by enfleshing or incarnating love can we be credible witnesses.

This witness begins at home, where we are often most challenged to live the love which Christ calls us to. The most difficult challenge is often forgiveness, especially forgiving family members.

I recently came across a great lesson about forgiveness that is both profound and practical. The preacher began by saying that nobody has ever died from a snake bite but rather it's the poison that kills. He compared the hurts of our hearts to the fanged bites that we have sometimes received from people. These do not kill us. It is rather the venom of the anger, the bitterness, the resentment, and the hate which poisons us from the inside that have devasting effects and ultimately kills. This is what poisons our hearts. While we cannot control people, we can always choose how to respond to every situation. The antidote that Christ gives us to the venom of sin is himself, which is His Divine Mercy which comes to us in the Eucharist through the Holy Spirit. Forgiveness alone can bring true healing and completely cure the effects of the venom which come from having been hurt, betrayed or maligned in any way. Let us pray that the Holy Spirit, which we will celebrate at Pentecost, comes into our hearts and heals them so they may be set free to love.





St. Francis' vocation began at the foot of the Cross at San Damiano where he prayed to God to "enlighten the darkness of his heart..." Later he heard Jesus say from the Cross, "Go, repair my Church" and as a result the Franciscan order was born. Since that time all Franciscans have a longstanding devotion to the Cross.

St. Leonard, coming out of this tradition, refined the devotion of the Cross by popularizing the Stations of the Cross and preached that we can be transformed in and through the Cross.
