OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION (RCIA)...RCIA is the process of welcoming new members to the Catholic Church. It is intended for adults who have never been baptized or for adults who have been baptized Christian and now wish to practice the faith in the Catholic tradition. It is an ongoing process of formation, catechesis and liturgical rites. Anyone interested is asked to call the rectory to discuss the process.

SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM...Parents are asked to call the parish office to register for the Baptismal Preparation Meeting and for the baptism of their child. Parents are expected to be participating members of the parish.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE...Couples seeking to be married in the Church are to make arrangements with the pastor six months to one year in advance of their intended wedding date, in order to allow time for marriage preparation. At least one of the engaged should be a registered and practicing member of the parish.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK...The Sacrament of the Sick is for the spiritual comfort, strength and healing of the ill. If there is a need for the sacrament in your family or household, please contact the rectory as soon as possible.

PASTOR'S CORNER

Prodigal Mercy

Luke 15:11-32

Each of the three main characters in the socalled "Parable of the Prodigal Son" carries distinct material for fruitful meditation—the younger son, the elder son, and the father.

The younger son strikes a universal chord in human nature, susceptible to the desires of the flesh and worldly allurements and experiencing the wretchedness that results after giving in to these temptations. The elder son exhibits all-too-human envy at another's good fortune. Complaining that his own past obedience is taken for granted, he resents that his younger brother, after wasting his inheritance, is received back into the household with full sonship restored, no questions asked and without any consequences for bad behavior. The father, on the other hand, is the only one who exhibits larger-thanlife, almost superhuman, characteristics. Laying aside his paternal dignity and rushing out with welcoming arms, the father's charity completely overlooks the sin of his profligate son, who in effect had wished him dead. The father then gently pleads with the resentful elder son, whose obedience to his father seems to have lacked the requisite motivation of filial love.

In this way, Jesus reveals the nature of God's unfathomable love, which extends to both the profligate and the pridefully self-righteous. The father calls for the finest robe to be put on his younger son, representing the restored dignity of his human nature, a ring for his finger signifying the return of his rights within the family, sandals for his feet, the completion of his outward glorious vesture, and the sacrificial feast to celebrate the family reunion.

Symbolically, the younger son calls to mind all who were outcast or marginalized from the heretofore people of God—sinners against God's law and tax collectors, who cooperated with the pagan authority. The parable ends with a poignant "question mark": Will the elder son come to the feast? Will he repent of his self-righteousness?

Whether in the past we have fit the model of one son or the other, will we be enlightened with a new vision of the infinite depth of God's mercy? Our Father wants to clothe us in the robe of his graces, place the ring bearing his name on our finger, our feet in sandals for gospel mission, and to celebrate with us the eternal sacrificial banquet of the Lamb among the communion of saints!
