ORDER OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS (OCIA) is the process of welcoming new members to the Catholic Church. It is intended for adults who have never been baptized or for adults who have been baptized Christian and now wish to practice the faith in the Catholic tradition. It is an ongoing process of formation, catechesis and liturgical rites. Anyone interested is asked to call the rectory to discuss the process.

SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM...Parents are asked to call the parish office to register for the Baptismal Preparation Meeting and for the baptism of their child. Parents are expected to be participating members of the parish.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE...Couples seeking to be married in the Church are to make arrangements with the pastor six months to one year in advance of their intended wedding date, in order to allow time for marriage preparation. At least one of the engaged should be a registered and practicing member of the parish.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK... The Sacrament of the Sick is for the spiritual comfort, strength and healing of the ill. If there is a need for the sacrament in your family or household, please contact the rectory as soon as possible.

PASTOR'S CORNER

Pentecost: A New Beginning

Acts of the Apostles 2:1-11

As we continue to work for an end to the threat of the coronavirus infections around the world, we are experiencing a rebirth of parish life, in which many of the faithful are returning to in-person worship. In what already has been a quickly changing world, we're experiencing new adaptations to workaday habits which are allowing more individual flexibility. On the discouraging side, there are new serious threats to world peace and its effects on the international economy, not to mention all-too-frequent tragic situations of random violence in our communities and schools.

In the midst of the storm clouds, the sun's warming rays occasionally break through. Those who value the faith are monitoring the situation with spiritual galvanometers. How is the Christian religion faring and what kind of difference is the Church making around us? Are we Catholics on the brink of a new era of opportunity to build a culture of life and a civilization of love? Will the natural idealism of the young bear fruit in devout practice of the faith, and will many step into the ordained ministries and the consecrated life of sacrificial service to Christ and his Church?

Since the descent of the Holy Spirit at that first Pentecost, the "Catholic moment" has always been there, but the time is now for us to realize it again. Some may feel that we're drowning in a sea of secularism and indifference to the faith, and many are. For this reason, the Church's responsibility to society at this time has never been more acute nor the imperative so strong. For a fulfilling earthly life during which to prepare for its eternal consequences, there is no greater initiative in which to play a part.

Today's feast of Pentecost, commemorating the "birthday" of the Church, is all about a new beginning in the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit, who is the outpouring of the Father and the Son, has given us access to the glory of heaven. May we live up to this call by abiding in the grace that has sanctified us!

Holy Spirit, be our strength and our stay at this critical time! ~Fr. David


