ORDER OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS (OCIA) is the process of welcoming new members to the Catholic Church. It is intended for adults who have never been baptized or for adults who have been baptized Christian and now wish to practice the faith in the Catholic tradition. It is an ongoing process of formation, catechesis and liturgical rites. Anyone interested is asked to call the rectory to discuss the process.

SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM...Parents are asked to call the parish office to register for the Baptismal Preparation Meeting and for the baptism of their child. Parents are expected to be participating members of the parish.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE...Couples seeking to be married in the Church are to make arrangements with the pastor six months to one year in advance of their intended wedding date, in order to allow time for marriage preparation. At least one of the engaged should be a registered and practicing member of the parish.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK... The Sacrament of the Sick is for the spiritual comfort, strength and healing of the ill. If there is a need for the sacrament in your family or household, please contact the rectory as soon as possible.

PASTOR'S CORNER

God's Victory in St. Paul

I Timothy 1:12-17

"Christ came into the world to save sinners." Of these I am the foremost." (I Timothy 1:15). From this statement of St. Paul's, we may surmise why he figures so prominently in the New Testament. His life was a demonstration of the power of the gospel. Paul's repentance from being, as he describes himself, an arrogant persecutor of Christians to full immersion in promulgating the gospel as Apostle to the Gentiles says to everybody: If this can happen to me, it can happen to you! There is no sin so great that God cannot turn your life around and use you in furthering his plan to bring the world to Christ. In fact, Paul seems to imply that there is no sin worse than hating Christ, which had been his motivation for hunting down and arresting followers of Jesus. Yet, through an encounter with the living Lord on the road to Damascus, Paul received the gift of divine enlightenment and was forever changed.

Similarly, the parable of the Prodigal Son indicates that God is always waiting for an opportunity to welcome the sinner back into his household. God can even work with repentance that may be imperfect, insincere and incommensurate with the harm done to oneself and others. The implication, too, is that however serious sins of the flesh are, and they can very well be mortal sins, God is not shocked by them. Rather, Jesus, we could say, pities us because enslaved to the passions of the body, we are prevented from flourishing as human beings. As long as we see ourselves at the "center of the wheel" rather than "at the rim" looking in toward Christ, we will never arrive at salvation.

But Christ's grace was victorious in St. Paul. Jesus strengthened him, had mercy on him, had faith in him, showered his love upon him, and chose him. Jesus knew that, once he had worked his miracle of grace in bringing him to conversion, Paul would be his greatest advocate among the nations. In light of the God of mercy fully revealed in his Son, Christ remains "king of the ages, incorruptible, invisible, the only God" (vs. 17), ready to forgive and restore the sinner to be able to live in the light of true human freedom.



Fr. Boniface's Mission



Fr. Boniface serves as Assistant Rector of the Seminary of his congregation, which was established in 1986, and is housing and preparing 40 men for religious life and the priesthood. In his words, "Inspired by the Ugandan martyrs of the 19th century, who were catechists and lay faithful, the purpose of our congregation is to develop the essential mystical, contemplative

dimension of the Church and a deepening of the Christian faith in Africa, without excluding other countries. Our motto is Prayer, Study and Work."

The Evangelizers work at being self-sufficient, helped by their pig farm that has grown to 50 pigs, which the seminarians look after and provide sustenance for them. Also associated with the Contemplative Evangelizers is the Sacred Heart High School for boys about 200 miles from Nairobi. The boys are formed with the same principles of prayer and study and have a chance for weekly Mass, including on Sundays and catechism classes.

Fr. Boniface is with us until the middle of October. During this time, I would like to extend an invitation to support his mission with a donation. Until then, you can drop off a check or donation at the rectory office. Please note "for Fr. 
