ORDER OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS (OCIA) is the process of welcoming new members to the Catholic Church. It is intended for adults who have never been baptized or for adults who have been baptized Christian and now wish to practice the faith in the Catholic tradition. It is an ongoing process of formation, catechesis and liturgical rites. Anyone interested is asked to call the rectory to discuss the process.

SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM...Parents are asked to call the parish office to register for the Baptismal Preparation Meeting and for the baptism of their child. Parents are expected to be participating members of the parish.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE...Couples seeking to be married in the Church are to make arrangements with the pastor six months to one year in advance of their intended wedding date, in order to allow time for marriage preparation. At least one of the engaged should be a registered and practicing member of the parish.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK...The Sacrament of the Sick is for the spiritual comfort, strength and healing of the ill. If there is a need for the sacrament in your family or household, please contact the rectory as soon as possible.

PASTOR'S CORNER

Living Truth

John 4:5-42

Beginning with a request for a drink and leading to an offer of "living water" (vs. 10), the trajectory of the conversation between Jesus and the woman at the well culminated in his self-identification as the Messiah. From their own historically related traditions, both Jews and Samaritans were looking for the Messiah to come. Ultimately, they would worship neither on the competing mountain in Samaria nor in Jerusalem, but "in Spirit and truth" (vs. 23). In Jesus, not only former enemies will be able to worship together, but the whole world, as well.

Accustomed as we are in our modern age to divisions among believers and non-believers alike, how are we doing with worship in Spirit and truth? Moved by the Spirit many believe that Jesus is more than a prophet, even the Savior of the world. While others may acknowledge him, they are indifferent or do not know how such faith can impact their lives. They are "spiritual but not religious," as is often said. To be sure, many "spiritual" people outdo Christians in virtuous living and in loving care and concern for others.

Likewise, our scientific age is replete with experts uncovering true things about the world. All recognize its order and beauty so intricately woven and interconnected from the minutest particles to the vastness of outer space. Yet where is the worship? Worship becomes possible only from a recognition of the Truth who is the source of all "truths." It is willingly and intentionally submitting oneself body and soul to that which is the bestower of meaning to all things. Many would recognize Spirit and truth in various aspects, but would they worship? I once served in the music ministry of a congregation where all agreed they should worship, and at the same time recognized the diverse and competing notions of whom or what should be worshipped. It made choosing music difficult.

Worship entails commitment. We define ourselves by that to which we commit. Our commitment to family makes us a member of the family, to the nation a citizen, to God his sons and daughters, to Christ members of his Mystical Body. We find our identity in the One whom we worship. As we receive his holy Body and Blood, especially, our worship in the Holy Mass is that by which Jesus communicates his identity to his people.

How does one convince others of the Truth behind all truths? Like the Samaritan woman, through personal encounter with the Truth and testimony to others as the opportunity arises, beginning with family and acquaintances. When we know him who is the Truth, we cannot but offer him our worship, all we have and all we are. Beginning simply with the act of worship, we reveal our true identity and offer to others the invitation to come to "know that this is truly the savior of the world" (v. 42).






