ORDER OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS (OCIA) is the process of welcoming new members to the Catholic Church. It is intended for adults who have never been baptized or for adults who have been baptized Christian and now wish to practice the faith in the Catholic tradition. It is an ongoing process of formation, catechesis and liturgical rites. Anyone interested is asked to call the rectory to discuss the process.

SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM...Parents are asked to call the parish office to register for the Baptismal Preparation Meeting and for the baptism of their child. Parents are expected to be participating members of the parish.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE...Couples seeking to be married in the Church are to make arrangements with the pastor six months to one year in advance of their intended wedding date, in order to allow time for marriage preparation. At least one of the engaged should be a registered and practicing member of the parish.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK...The Sacrament of the Sick is for the spiritual comfort, strength and healing of the ill. If there is a need for the sacrament in your family or household, please contact the rectory as soon as possible.

PASTOR'S CORNER

Peace or Division?

"Do you think that I have come to establish peace on the earth? No, I tell you, but rather division." (Luke 12:51)

In today's gospel passage, Jesus counterposes peace and division as opposites. Where there is unity, there is peace; where there is division, a lack of peace.

For many of us who were adults or grew up during the Cold War, the Berlin Wall symbolized division between the free West and the East oppressed by atheistic Communism. It produced in us a not-so-subtle feeling of anxiety and fear of that false ideology encroaching like a cancer on other countries. Such was the thinking that fueled our immersion in the Vietnam War. That fear has recently staged an unwelcome return with the conflict in Ukraine giving rise, if we are not careful, to the possibility of escalation and an all-out nuclear exchange between NATO allies and Russia.

How strange, then, that Jesus would come out against peace and in favor of division! After all, the seventh Beatitude is "Blessed are the peacemakers..." (Matthew 5:9) At the Last Supper, Jesus offered to his disciples: "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you." (John 14:27) There also he prayed for unity among his disciples, "that they may all be one..." (John 17:21)

To solve this riddle, truth is the source of both peace and division. When truth about some particular matter becomes apparent to all, there is agreement. Justice then becomes possible leading to peace. However, when the truth is not apparent to all, division remains, justice is incomplete and a lack of peace prevails.

In Jesus, Truth entered the world. His mission was to light a fire on earth that would divide truth from falsehood, good from evil, like a smelting furnace purifies ore and brings forth a precious metal. By his baptism into death, he let the forces of evil have their way. And yet by taking the sins of the world on himself through the cross and being raised from the dead, he recreated humanity in his own image and likeness, enabling believers to live in peace as children of God and brothers and sisters to each other.

The saving work of Christ is neither self-evident nor apparent to all. Some will receive the Spirit of Truth and some will not, thus dividing even family members against each other. Unity is even imperfect among Christians, although not keeping us from cooperating in charitable works. What a witness would result if Christians, some of whom are so close yet so far apart in their theological outlooks, would recognize that Christ's intended Church has one faith, one governance, and one sacramental system. Unity, not uniformity, is essential. Let the Church show forth the richness of its legitimate differences! This makes us the unique vessel of Truth that the world needs for peace and salvation!


