**ORDER OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS (OCIA)** is the process of welcoming new members to the Catholic Church. It is intended for adults who have never been baptized or for adults who have been baptized Christian and now wish to practice the faith in the Catholic tradition. It is an ongoing process of formation, catechesis and liturgical rites. Anyone interested is asked to call the rectory to discuss the process.

SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM...Parents are asked to call the parish office to register for the Baptismal Preparation Meeting and for the baptism of their child. Parents are expected to be participating members of the parish.

**SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE...**Couples seeking to be married in the Church are to make arrangements with the pastor six months to one year in advance of their intended wedding date, in order to allow time for marriage preparation. At least one of the engaged should be a registered and practicing member of the parish.



## PASTOR'S CORNER

## The Cost of Discipleship

Luke 14:25-33

Jesus sets the bar quite high for someone to be his follower. You cannot be my disciple unless you renounce your family relationships, accept suffering persecution, and leave all your possessions behind. But at the call of the fishermen, that's exactly what his first disciples did. After hearing Jesus speak at length from the boat near the shore and being directed to the miraculous catch of fish as a confirmation of the truth of what he was saying, Peter, James and John "left everything and followed him" (Luke 5:11).

To us now, the requirements of being a disciple become more realistic and manageable when his stipulations are transposed into positive form. Hating one's father and mother becomes: If you want to be my disciple, see God as your One Father, Jesus as your brother, and their Holy Spirit as your constant interior Guide, Companion and Advocate.

Carrying your cross becomes: Be ready to accept misunderstanding, suffering and persecution as a sign that you are on the right track. When they damage and destroy the icons of your faith and graffiti your places of worship, know that you are being confirmed in your witness of the Truth.

Renouncing all your possessions becomes: Have Jesus as your one and only possession. Acquire all his virtues as the qualities of your soul. Clothe yourself in the robe of righteousness, adorn yourself with his heavenly graces, and arm yourself with the "sword of the Spirit, which is the Word of God" (Ephesians 6:17).

Since the Beatitudes are promised to the true disciples of Jesus (Matthew 5:1-12), let's attach one to each of his requirements. Leaving the security of your family relations and seeing God as your only Father is the 6<sup>th</sup> Beatitude: "Blessed are the pure of heart, for they will see God."

Carrying your cross is the 8<sup>th</sup> and final Beatitude:

"Blessed are they who are persecuted for the sake of righteousness...Rejoice and be glad, for your reward will be great in heaven. Thus they persecuted the prophets who were before you."

Detaching yourself from all your possessions is the 1<sup>st</sup> Beatitude: "Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven."

As we participate in the life of Jesus within his holy Church, each of us needs to weigh the cost of discipleship in connection with each's God-given vocation, which may involve cultivating one's family relationships. Fulfilling other responsibilities, we all called to leave the world a better place than we found it. Through authentic discipleship we are already making the kingdom of God "present in sign; when the Lord comes it will reach its completion." (Gaudium et Spes # 39, Second Vatican Council) There is no greater adventure than to be a disciple of Jesus. I highly recommend it!


