ORDER OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS (OCIA) is the process of welcoming new members to the Catholic Church. It is an ongoing process of formation, catechesis and liturgical rites. Anyone interested is asked to call the rectory to discuss the process.



PASTOR'S CORNER

Increase our Faith

Luke 17:5-10

Over the course of the gospels, Jesus is recorded several times as addressing his disciples "O you of little faith" (for example, Matthew 6:30). Eventually, then, the disciples requested of him, "Increase our faith" (Luke 17:5). Jesus' response further challenged them: If they had any faith whatsoever they could uproot a mulberry tree (or move a mountain, according to Mt. 17:20). The implication was that either they had no faith at all, or that Jesus was exaggerating to make a point about the power of prayer. The trouble is that someone is bound to take him literally and be disappointed that God is not at our beck and call to do anything we want. In serious matters this can lead them to get angry at God, lose faith and leave the Church.

Clearly, as disciples, we do have faith but seem not to be able to move mulberry trees or mountains simply by praying. To solve the dilemma that Jesus is neither exaggerating nor commanding the impossible, the interpretation is given that the amount of our faith may be beside the point. Rather, we should employ the faith we do have toward selfless service. Such is the example of the farm worker who comes in after a long day and rather than rest, must prepare the master's meal, only after which can he have his own meal. No special reward is forthcoming, only that he was doing his expected duty (vss. 7-10). Perhaps there is a less exhausting way to understand our faith and what we should pray for, rather than having to wait for our eternal heavenly rest.

When Jesus taught the Our Father to his disciples (Luke 11:2 ff), he concluded by saying that if we give good gifts to our children, "how much more will the Father in heaven give the holy Spirit to those who ask him?" (vs. 13) This suggests that God will surely answer our requests that have salvific value. Such would be, "Lord, help me to be sorry for my sins," or to rise above any bad habits that inhibit my maturing in Christ. Another example might be for patience in suffering, which brings us into union with the suffering Christ, and thus to a greater glory to come.

I John 3:22-24 has a helpful perspective on this: We receive from God whatever we ask, because we keep his commandments and do what pleases him...to love one another as he commanded us... "and the way we know that he remains in us is from the Spirit that he gave us." In responding to our prayer, God respects the time it takes for our conversion and for us to learn the mystery of suffering. It might be that when we look back at how much God has enlightened us over the course of our lives, we see that he uprooted mulberry trees and moved mountains to make way in our souls for himself.




