**ORDER OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS (OCIA)** is the process of welcoming new members to the Catholic Church. It is intended for adults who have never been baptized or for adults who have been baptized Christian and now wish to practice the faith in the Catholic tradition. It is an ongoing process of formation, catechesis and liturgical rites. Anyone interested is asked to call the rectory to discuss the process.

**SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM...**Parents are asked to call the parish office to register for the Baptismal Preparation Meeting and for the baptism of their child. Parents are expected to be participating members of the parish.

**SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE...**Couples seeking to be married in the Church are to make arrangements with the pastor six months to one year in advance of their intended wedding date, in order to allow time for marriage preparation. At least one of the engaged should be a registered and practicing member of the parish.

**ANOINTING OF THE SICK...** The Sacrament of the Sick is for the spiritual comfort, strength and healing of the ill. If there is a need for the sacrament in your family or household, please contact the rectory as soon as possible.

#### PASTOR'S CORNER

#### God's Claim

Luke 17:11-19

God has a claim on us. Everything we have and are belongs to him who created us. In our dependence upon him, we in turn have a claim on God, for he wants us to ask him for what we need. In our immersion into the good things of this life, it is easy to forget both that he created us and that he wants us to ask.

What triggers, then, our response of thanksgiving, praise and petition? At times it could be a descent into a situation of desperate need, like the ten lepers who appealed to Jesus for healing. We are driven to our knees because there is nowhere else to go except to God. Once we have experienced help from God, we must return thanks. And yet, what is the likelihood that we do? According to the episode of the lepers, it was not impressive—one in ten, and he was a Samaritan foreigner.

As Catholics, we have the greatest possible act of thanksgiving and petition to God, the liturgy of Lord's Day worship. But the realization of the claim that God has on us must be ingrained in our souls and become a habitual return of gratitude. No act of thanksgiving can outdo Jesus' self-offering to the Father, and no greater act of petition can be made except through Christ our Lord. That is the action of the Mass. To love the one who has a claim on us is to love the Mass, which is our grateful response.

One of the perplexing realities of our contemporary life is how the one-in-ten statistics are born out, even among those who were raised in the faith and have absented themselves. At the same time, one is encouraged by the commitment that is there, especially in our parish churches and in the faith communities of our non-Catholic brothers and sisters. Let us sit at the feet of the Master, still among us, the same yesterday, today and forever (Hebrews 13:8) and hear his teaching in the holy Word. He gives himself to us ultimately in his most holy bodily and divine presence in the elements of Holy Communion. How can we not return time and time again and give thanks and praise for this great gift of salvation and healing!

Work has begun on scraping and repainting the external surfaces of the church windows and will continue through Friday, Oct. 31. Exterior restoration of the church windows is underway and will continue through Oct. 31. All precautions are

During the first week, crews will focus on the church steeple, and a crane will be positioned in front of the church. As a result, the front parking spots will be closed and the front doors will be inaccessible; please use the side entrances. FAWS drop-off and pick-up traffic will follow the usual flow, though the lane in front of the church will shift slightly to the left to accommodate the crane.
