ORDER OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS (OCIA) is the process of welcoming new members to the Catholic Church. It is intended for adults who have never been baptized or for adults who have been baptized Christian and now wish to practice the faith in the Catholic tradition. It is an ongoing process of formation, catechesis and liturgical rites. Anyone interested is asked to call the rectory to discuss the process.

SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM... Parents are asked to call the parish office to register for the Baptismal Preparation Meeting and for the baptism of their child. Parents are expected to be participating members of the parish.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE... Couples seeking to be married in the Church are to make arrangements with the pastor six months to one year in advance of their intended wedding date, in order to allow time for marriage preparation. At least one of the engaged should be a registered and practicing member of the parish.

ANointing OF THE SICK... The Sacrament of the Sick is for the spiritual comfort, strength and healing of the ill. If there is a need for the sacrament in your family or household, please contact the rectory as soon as possible.

PASTOR'S CORNER

Evidence of the Kingdom

Matthew 11:2-11

When John the Baptist sent disciples to Jesus inquiring whether he was “the one who is to come, or should we look for another?” (*vs. 3*), he responded with evidence of the advent of the kingdom. The miracles of Jesus on behalf of the sick, the poor, the possessed, the blind and the lame, and even the dead were the fulfillment of prophetic signs put forth by Isaiah centuries before, which were to accompany the Messiah’s arrival.

Two millennia later, as we look around, do we still see signs that the kingdom of God is here? True, miracles of healing occasionally occur. The contemporary process of the canonization of saints usually requires evidence of healing miracles from their intercession. Perhaps in the minds of many, though, the sense of expectation and newness of the Christian faith and its gospel have long since worn off, leading to lukewarm hearts and indifference to faith practice—“Been there; done that.”

Yet arguably, the bright light of God’s glory in the coming of the God-man has forever illuminated the human psyche and has led to the “miracle” of modern science and technology. The one, holy, Catholic and apostolic Church, founded by the Savior and enlivened by his Spirit, which is the only institution to have perdured over these centuries, gave birth to the universities and research institutions that have produced these “miracles” and the hospitals where countless marvelous healings take place.

Most especially, the love of Jesus has remade a fallen world in the image of its Creator. The more that God’s love is persecuted around the world, the more it is germinated in the hearts of the faithful and spreads. This is as true in lands where the political order suffers chaos, violence, and a lack of social justice as it is in our own country, which has its own related problems.

John the Baptist’s inquiry revealed a shortcoming in the Old Testament notion of the Messiah—a military strongman to throw out oppressing powers and cast judgment on the world. Judgment will surely come, but in the meantime, we who see deeply into the signs of the Spirit of Jesus at work in the world today receive his “beatitude,” meant as a fraternal admonition to his cousin the Baptist: “Blessed is the one who takes no offense at me” (*vs. 6*). We are citizens of the kingdom of Jesus, still here, sometimes appearing in the likeness of a small, beleaguered community, but nonetheless thriving in faith, love, grace and good works!

There is an Advent spirit in the heart of every human person. It is one of longing, of yearning for a fulfillment that somehow lies beyond ourselves; for we long for the coming of the Lord. As you give your gift to St. Vincent de Paul, your heart will discover the true meaning of Christmas as you help those who are suffering and poor to long for the coming of the Lord. In the month of October, the St. Aloysius St. Vincent de Paul Conference provided 12 families (31 persons) with assistance for rent (\$1,342) and electric (\$585). Additionally, the Food Pantry assisted 69 families comprised of 137 adults and 44 children. These totals include delivery to 15 Cedar Lane residents, 49 families who came to the pantry on Saturday, October 18 and 5 families which SVdP members made home visits to in the month of October.
