ORDER OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS (OCIA) is the process of welcoming new members to the Catholic Church. It is intended for adults who have never been baptized or for adults who have been baptized Christian and now wish to practice the faith in the Catholic tradition. It is an ongoing process of formation, catechesis and liturgical rites. Anyone interested is asked to call the rectory to discuss the process.

SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM...Parents are asked to call the parish office to register for the Baptismal Preparation Meeting and for the baptism of their child. Parents are expected to be participating members of the parish.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE...Couples seeking to be married in the Church are to make arrangements with the pastor six months to one year in advance of their intended wedding date, in order to allow time for marriage preparation. At least one of the engaged should be a registered and practicing member of the parish.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK...The Sacrament of the Sick is for the spiritual comfort, strength and healing of the ill. If there is a need for the sacrament in your family or household, please contact the rectory as soon as possible.

PASTOR'S CORNER

The Holiest of Families

The Solemnity of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph


The One God, Triune in Persons, is the holiest of "families"—Father, Son and Holy Spirit. As a community of Divine Persons, our God should be imaged in every Christian family. God who is love, is at the center of the family, founded on spousal love and filial love for children, who are its natural fruit.

In becoming man, God brought together Mary and Joseph as the human Holy Family and graced them for their role in the birth of the Savior and the story of our salvation. As God's closest collaborators, they make up the "Hypostatic Order" with Jesus. By this is meant that Mary and Joseph were so closely associated with God's plan of bringing into being the "Hypostatic Union" of the divine and human natures in the One Person of Jesus Christ that they have been given a unique and irreplaceable status. In the virginal conception and in giving birth to the Son of God, Mary as a human being, had a divine motherhood. In his obedience to the message of the angel about Mary's pregnancy and in accepting his role as Mary's spouse, Joseph, too, is a member of the "Hypostatic Order." Not being the biological father of Jesus, but nonetheless a real father by legal adoption, Joseph faithfully fulfilled his role as caretaker and guardian of the Holy Family.

God immersed himself in an unprecedented way in the human race through the Holy Family. The Son of God assumed a human nature by taking on flesh from the Blessed Virgin Mary. To underline the credibility of the Incarnation, Joseph, provided the connection to the ancient Messianic promise to King David, so that Jesus would be known by many as Son of David. In this way, God worked through Israel to bring salvation to the whole human race.

By our initiation into Christ and the family of God, we too are drawn up into the "Hypostatic Order" of the Holy Family, and indeed sharers in the divine life of God—Father, Son and Holy Spirit!






