ORDER OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS (OCIA) is the process of welcoming new members to the Catholic Church. It is intended for adults who have never been baptized or for adults who have been baptized Christian and now wish to practice the faith in the Catholic tradition. It is an ongoing process of formation, catechesis and liturgical rites. Anyone interested is asked to call the rectory to discuss the process.

SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM...Parents are asked to call the parish office to register for the Baptismal Preparation Meeting and for the baptism of their child. Parents are expected to be participating members of the parish.


SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE...Couples seeking to be married in the Church are to make arrangements with the pastor six months to one year in advance of their intended wedding date, in order to allow time for marriage preparation. At least one of the engaged should be a registered and practicing member of the parish.

PASTOR'S CORNER

Gifts to the Divine Giver

Matthew 2:1-12

One cannot miss the irony of the Magis' inquiry in the city where King Herod was presiding: "Where is the newborn king of the Jews?" Their question suggested to Herod that a usurpation of the throne was underway. One can see this replayed in the saga a thousand years earlier with king Saul and David. After God had rejected Saul as king and without Saul's voluntary abdication, David was surreptitiously anointed king of Israel by the prophet Samuel. This began Saul's subtle and not-so-subtle persecution of David, which ended only with the death of Saul in battle. It is notable that Jesus, who was popularly known as "son of David," would go through a similar life-threatening escape from Herod's plot.

In the midst of the high-stakes drama, the arrival of the Magi represent the first fruits of the nations who come to Christ. Matthew will end his gospel on a similar note, as Jesus gives the Great Commission to his apostles: "Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations..." The world would come to Christ through faith and witness to his presence among the community of believers.

At this early stage, however, it is impossible to know how the Magi regarded the newborn king of the Jews. On one hand, the childhood narratives in the gospels are highly symbolic, especially with historical parallels, like the one with Saul and David noted above. At the very least, the Magi regarded the newborn king as a person who embodied hope. But what jurisdiction did he have over them? Did they regard him as God? Did they know anything about the Old Testament history of prophetic Messianic expectations? Whether they knew or not, the gifts they brought revealed the truth of the matter: gold for a king, frankincense for God, and myrrh for one who was to die. Even his disciples who went around with him thirty years later, saw him up close, and received his teachings could still not fully anticipate how the story of salvation would play itself out with the suffering and death of Christ.

Jesus is God's supreme gift to the human race, "a savior...who is Christ and Lord" (Luke 2:11). What can we give in return to him who has everything? We can give him our very selves, all we have and all we are!
