ORDER OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS (OCIA) is the process of welcoming new members to the Catholic Church. It is intended for adults who have never been baptized or for adults who have been baptized Christian and now wish to practice the faith in the Catholic tradition. It is an ongoing process of formation, catechesis and liturgical rites. Anyone interested is asked to call the rectory to discuss the process.

SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM... Parents are asked to call the parish office to register for the Baptismal Preparation Meeting and for the baptism of their child. Parents are expected to be participating members of the parish.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE... Couples seeking to be married in the Church are to make arrangements with the pastor six months to one year in advance of their intended wedding date, in order to allow time for marriage preparation. At least one of the engaged should be a registered and practicing member of the parish.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK... The Sacrament of the Sick is for the spiritual comfort, strength and healing of the ill. If there is a need for the sacrament in your family or household, please contact the rectory as soon as possible.

PASTOR'S CORNER

Knowing God

Trinity Sunday

Sometimes children ask, if God made me, then who made God? The mere fact that things exist points to a being who was not created at all. That being we call God, who always was and always will be, whose very nature is to exist. This cannot be said of any created thing. God would have had to exist before anything else, because nothing comes from nothing, and “nothingness” is but a mental construct. But more profound than this is that the Creator God is relational within himself, a Three-ness of Persons, involving mind, will and love, all of which are one and eternal.

The term “Trinity” comes to us from Sacred Tradition as a way of expressing the three-fold distinction in God and his One-ness, a “Tri-unity” of Father, Son and Holy Spirit. We come to the knowledge of the Trinitarian inner nature of God by his revelation to us in Jesus Christ. In taking upon himself a human nature, the Son made God visible, such that everything he said and did displayed the unity of Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

There is plenty of evidence that one can have a relationship with each of the Divine Persons. Our various prayers indicate this as we direct ourselves to one or other of the Persons, for example, the Our Father. Most of the celebrant’s prayers at Mass begin by addressing God the Father as Lord. After the consecration, we appeal to Jesus personally, “Save us, Savior of the world...” and before Communion, “Lord, I am not worthy...” Prior to Pentecost, especially, we pray, “Come, Holy Spirit...” Nonetheless, from our position as creatures, whatever is directed to one of the Persons is heard by all.

In the Creed we also recognize distinct tasks done by each of the Persons. Because of his priority in eternally begetting the Son, God the Father is called the Creator. While remaining co-equal to the Father, the Son is like an agent because he eternally proceeds from the Father, as a word goes outward, communicating the state of mind of the speaker. The Holy Spirit is seen as sanctifier, because God transforms our lives from within, and that is a spiritual effect. We must keep in mind, however, that what God does in respect to that which is outside himself, the Divine Persons act together.

Even though the Incarnation is unique to the Son, we must resist the notion that the union of the Uncreated and created natures in himself divides him from the other Persons. This makes it all the more astonishing that the human nature of Jesus is the way that we become united to God, sharers in the divine nature as sons and daughters in the Son!

God can be none other than three Divine Persons united as One. As Eternal Mind, Will and Love, God is the paradigm for human relationships. When through the Spirit we are enlightened as to his inner nature, we see human relationships fulfilled in the life of Christ, in his divine family, the Church.
