ORDER OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS (OCIA) is the process of welcoming new members to the Catholic Church. It is intended for adults who have never been baptized or for adults who have been baptized Christian and now wish to practice the faith in the Catholic tradition. It is an ongoing process of formation, catechesis and liturgical rites. Anyone interested is asked to call the rectory to discuss the process.

SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM... Parents are asked to call the parish office to register for the Baptismal Preparation Meeting and for the baptism of their child. Parents are expected to be participating members of the parish.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE... Couples seeking to be married in the Church are to make arrangements with the pastor six months to one year in advance of their intended wedding date, in order to allow time for marriage preparation. At least one of the engaged should be a registered and practicing member of the parish.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK... The Sacrament of the Sick is for the spiritual comfort, strength and healing of the ill. If there is a need for the sacrament in your family or household, please contact the rectory as soon as possible.

PASTOR'S CORNER

Catholic patriotism goes like this: The Catholic faith can do a lot for our country. In turn, the ideals envisioned by our founding fathers compare favorably with Catholic principles. Everything Americans can agree on that is truly good is consistent with our Catholic faith and morals. And we Catholics believe that everything about our faith and morals is good for our country. The reality of having a free country is that not everyone is going to agree on everything. But take an example of what we can agree on, that no one is above the law. God is the ultimate giver of the law. He is the goodness toward which the law aspires, and he places the law within the conscience of every human being.

Take something that not all Americans can agree on, the right to life of every preborn baby. To respect the life of unborn children is good for America. The protection of innocent human life is the foundation of all other rights and places a justifiable limit on an individual's pursuit of freedom and happiness. Since America is not a theocracy, government legitimately constituted by the people enacts particular laws as best as they can see the light. The Church can be a guide in this way.

In applying the principles of Catholic social justice, the Church is ready to comment on and critique the results of laws and policies formulated at all levels of government. In recent decades, the Church has formulated seven general principles, as follows: 1. the life and dignity of the human person, 2. the call to family, community and participation, 3. embracing of our rights and responsibilities, 4. the fundamental option toward the poor and vulnerable, 5. the dignity of work and the rights of workers, 6. solidarity with all levels of society, and 7. care for God's creation.

An absolute separation between Church and State in our country or any other is impossible because man is fundamentally a religious being. Our government cannot impose a state religion on the people. Nonetheless, we can invite others to consider the Catholic faith. It might just hold the key to the future flourishing of our blessed country whose 250th anniversary we celebrate!

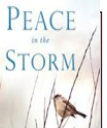
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WHEN: Saturday, July 18th, Tailgate party starts at 4pm, gates open at 5:30pm.
