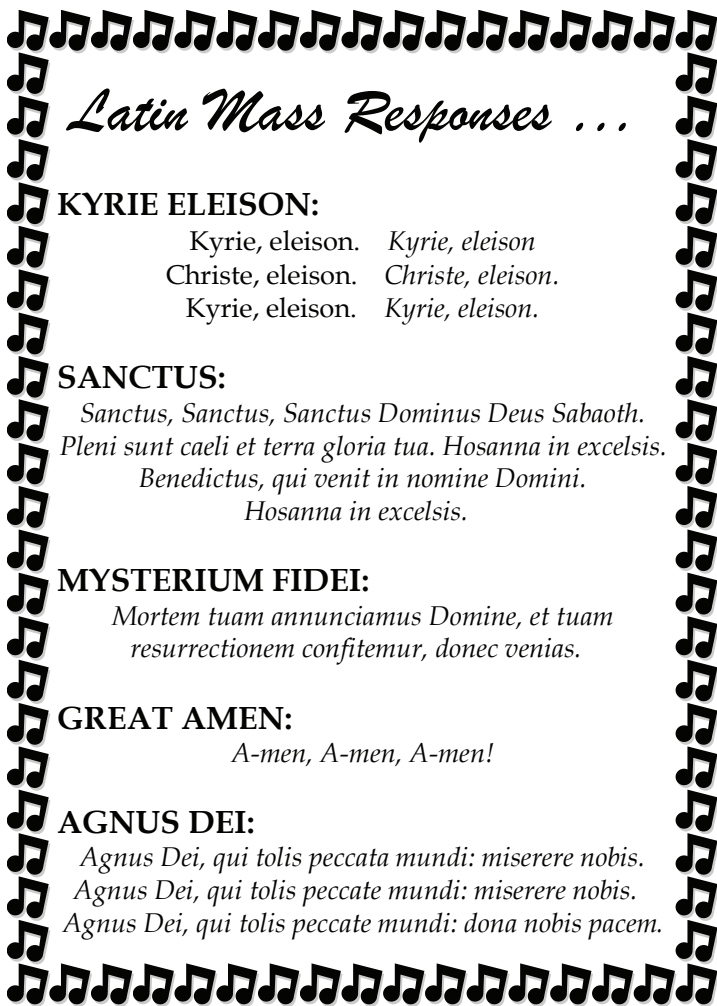

JESUS' MINISTRY SUMMARIZED

The story of the raising of Lazarus from the dead is the single longest story (apart from the Passion) in the Gospel of John. In it we find a summary of most of Jesus' ministry. We see his very human nature as he is moved by Martha and Mary's sorrows and as he himself weeps at the tomb of Lazarus. He is the wisdom of God's Word made flesh as he explains to his followers that the death of Lazarus will serve as a sign of the glory of God. He crowns the miracles he works in John's Gospel (which began with the most "human" miracle of making new wine at Cana's wedding) by raising Lazarus from the dead—a "preview," if you will, of his own death and resurrection to come. This portrait of Jesus reminds us, as we near the end of our Lenten journey, that he is with us, knows us, understands us in every moment of our lives. He knows the joy of our human feasting, he knows the sorrow of our weeping. As we prepare to walk with him through the days of Holy Week, we are filled with faith that—through Christ—God's glory will be with us in every moment of our lives and—with Christ—in our life everlasting.

TODAY'S READINGS

First Reading—Thus says the LORD GOD: I will open your graves, have you rise from them, and settle you on your land. (Ezekiel 37:12-14).

Psalms—With the Lord there is mercy and fullness of redemption (Psalm 130).

Second Reading—If Christ is in you, the spirit is alive even if the body is dead because of sin (Romans 8:8-11).

Gospel—Lazarus, dead for four days, came out of his tomb when Jesus called his name. Many of those who had seen what had happened began to believe in Jesus (John 11:1-45 or 11:3-7, 17, 20-27, 33b-45).

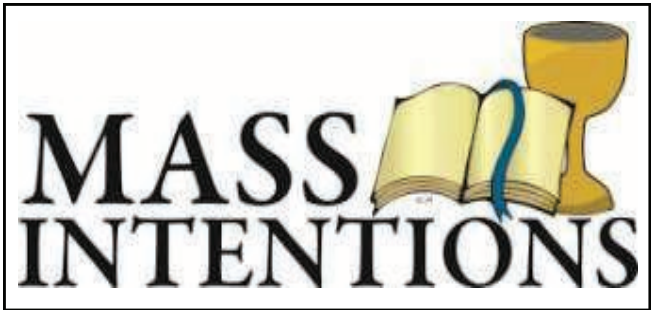

Dear Parishioners,

MASS AND ANOINTING OF THE SICK ... Saturday, March 28 at 12 noon in English.

LENTEN OBSERVANCES ... During the season of Lent, the Church urges the faithful to reflect a spirit of penance in their daily lives through performing acts of fast and abstinence.

FASTING AND ABSTINENCE ... During Lent, a few of our Lenten Observances revolve around fasting and abstinence. According to the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops: Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence. For members of the Latin Catholic Church (that's us), the norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Latin Catholic Church from age 14 onwards. If possible, the fast on Good Friday is continued until the Easter Vigil (on Holy Saturday night) as the "paschal fast" to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus, and to prepare ourselves to share more fully and to celebrate more readily his Resurrection.

WHAT WILL YOU DO FOR LENT? ... More prayer, quiet time, no cell phones or i-pads for an hour a day, donations to the homeless or other charities, Mass on Saturdays and Sundays, Stations of the Cross, Holy Hour and Benediction on Fridays from 12:30 to 2:30 pm? There are so many things to do and to consider for the 40 days of prayer, fasting and almsgiving.

IN CHURCH ... are you texting or praying ... are you playing games or reading the Bible selections for the Sunday? Leave the phone in your pocket, put it off and ENJOY some quality time with God in church!

NEW AD SPONSORS ... please notice the businesses that are supporting our weekly bulletin ... we are grateful to the many businesses and offices that advertise and support the printing of our Sunday bulletin ... please consider patronizing them and tell them you saw their ad in our Sunday bulletin.

AS ALWAYS ... a reminder about arriving early --- or at least, on time --- for Mass ... Jesus deserves our complete attention from the beginning of the Mass until the end ... on time for the Masses on Saturday at 5:30 pm or 7 pm and Sunday at 7:30 am, 9 am, 10:30 am, and 12 noon.

PARKING ... please be courteous ... do not use two spaces ... do not block other cars ... both parking lots are open --- on Castle Hill and on Purdy Street.

CREMATION ... as Catholics, we have permission of the church to be cremated ... the procedure for the funeral is: WAKE SERVICE WITH THE BODY, FUNERAL MASS WITH THE BODY, CREMATION and burial as soon as possible after the cremation ... we should not save the ashes at home, bring them to the beach or the mountains or leave them in the funeral home ... the ashes are to be treated with respect and dignity like a body and be buried as soon as possible after the cremation.

MASS INTENTIONS ... you can remember a family member or friend with an intention at a specific Mass come to the rectory for a specific date ... the offering is \$15 and Mass cards are available with each Mass ... the intentions can be for a living or deceased person ... intentions are printed in the bulletin.

RECEPTION OF HOLY COMMUNION ... Just a reminder that we ask that you preferably receive Holy Communion in your hands, by holding out both hands one on top of the other. Also remember that the proper response to the priest before receiving Holy Communion is "Amen," not "Thank you."

BAPTISMS ... all Catholics should be baptized ... parents should be

registered in the parish and attending weekly Sunday Mass in order to have the child baptized ... godparents must be practicing Catholics who have received the sacraments of Baptism, Holy Communion and Confirmation and, if married, married in the church ... godparents must be members of a parish and must be attending weekly Mass ... if you are going to be a godparent, it makes perfect and reasonable sense that you are practicing the faith and that you are a model for the child.

SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY ... the Catholic Church teaches that marriage is between a man and a woman, a sign of LOVE and LIFE ... Catholics should be married in the church and, if married only civilly, should speak to one of the priests about receiving the sacrament in the Church (called convalidation) ... please know that you are welcome to ask questions and to receive direction and advice about the SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY ... Please remember to secure a date for your wedding before making any arrangements with caterers, limo drivers, family and friends.

FUNERAL ARRANGEMENTS ... the usual practice for Catholic burials is a wake service in a funeral home, a Funeral Mass in the parish church, burial of the body or cremains in a cemetery (preferably a Catholic cemetery) ... speak with one of the priests for assistance before a death occurs and speak with a reputable funeral home director about pre-arrangements ... cremains (ashes) are held in the same reverence and respect as a body and so they should be treated carefully, respectfully, reverentially and buried as soon as possible after cremation.

PARISH REGISTRATION ... all members of the parish should be registered and receive parish mailings and envelopes ... if you are an adult (18 years and older), you should register to receive the envelopes and other information from the parish ... you need to be registered in order to receive recommendation letters, financial statements, tuition rates and other parish related issues ... HOW TO REGISTER? Come to the rectory office on Castle Hill Ave.

LATE FOR CHURCH? ... Why? Please resolve to arrive early for Mass, say a prayer, read the Scripture and be ready when we start it will make the Mass more prayerful and meaningful for all. Remember, if you miss the readings, you miss the teachings of Christ. St. Jerome wrote, "Ignorance of Scripture is ignorance of Christ." Getting to Church on time matters.

VISITING OF THE SICK OR HOMEBOUND ... If you know of anyone who is sick or homebound and would like to receive communion, Please call the rectory to give us your information as well as the information of the person who wishes to receive communion. They must reside in our parish area.

MISA Y UNCIÓN DE LOS ENFERMOS ... el sábado, 28 de marzo a las 12 del mediodía en inglés.

OBSERVACIONES CUARESMALES ... Durante el tiempo de Cuaresma, la Iglesia insta a los fieles a reflejar un espíritu de penitencia en su vida cotidiana mediante la realización de actos de ayuno y abstinencia.

AYUNO Y ABSTINENCIA ... Durante la Cuaresma, algunas de nuestras celebraciones de Cuaresma giran alrededor del ayuno y abstinencia. De acuerdo con la Conferencia Estadounidense de Obispos Católicos: El Miércoles de Ceniza y el Viernes Santo son días obligados de ayuno y abstinencia para los católicos. Además, los viernes de Cuaresma son días de abstinencia obligatorios. Para los miembros de la Iglesia Católica que siguen el rito latino (que somos nosotros), las normas sobre el ayuno son obligatorias desde los 18 años hasta los 59 años. Cuando se ayuna, una persona se le permite comer una comida completa, así como dos comidas más pequeñas que en conjunto no son iguales a una comida completa. Las normas concernientes a la abstinencia de carne son obligatorias para miembros de la Iglesia Católica del rito latino de los 14 años en adelante. Si es posible, el ayuno del Viernes Santo se continúa hasta la Vigilia de Pascua (en la noche del Sábado Santo) como el "ayuno pascual" en honor a la pasión y muerte del Señor Jesús, y para prepararnos a compartir y celebrar con mayor facilidad su Resurrección.

¿QUÉ VAS A HACER PARA LA CUARESMA? ... Más oración, momentos de tranquilidad, no teléfonos celulares o ipads por una hora al día, donaciones a las personas sin hogar u otras organizaciones benéficas, misa los sábados y domingos, Estaciones de la Cruz, Hora Santa y Bendición los viernes de 12:30 a 2:30 pm? Hay tantas cosas que hacer y considerar en los 40 días de oración, ayuno y limosna.

EN LA IGLESIA ... estás enviando mensajes de texto o rezando ... estás jugando juegos o leyendo las selecciones de la Biblia para el domingo? Dejar el teléfono en el bolsillo, apagar el teléfono y DISFRUTAR de un tiempo de calidad con Dios en la iglesia!

NUEVOS PATROCINADORES DE ANUNCIOS ... por favor notar los negocios que están apoyando nuestro boletín semanal ... estamos agradecidos a los muchos negocios y oficinas que se anuncian y apoyan la impresión de nuestro boletín de los domingos ... por favor considerar apoyarlos y decirles que usted vio su anuncio en nuestro boletín del domingo.

COMO SIEMPRE ... un recordatorio acerca de llegar temprano --- o al menos, a tiempo --- para la misa ... Jesús merece toda nuestra atención desde el principio de la misa hasta el final ... a tiempo para las misas los sábados a las 5:30 pm o 7:00 pm y los domingos a las 7:30 am, 9 am, 10:30 am, y 12 del mediodía.

PARQUEO ... por favor sea cortés ... no use dos espacios ... no bloquear otros coches ... ambos parqueos están abiertos --- en Castle Hill y en Purdy Street.

CREMACIÓN ... como católicos, tenemos el permiso de la iglesia para ser cremados ... el procedimiento para el funeral es: VELORIO CON EL CUERPO, MISA FUNERAL CON EL CUERPO, CREMACIÓN y entierro lo más pronto posible después de la cremación ... no debemos guardar las cenizas en el hogar, llevar a la playa o la montañas o dejar en la funeraria ... las cenizas deben ser tratadas con respeto y dignidad como un cuerpo y ser enterradas tan pronto como sea posible después de la cremación.

INTENCIONES DE LA MISA ... usted puede recordar un miembro de la familia o amigo con una intención en una Misa específica ... venir a la rectoría para una fecha específica ... la ofrenda es \$15 y tarjetas de la Misa están disponibles con cada Misa ... las intenciones pueden ser para una persona viva o difunta ... intenciones son impresas en el boletín, colocados en el altar y mencionadas por el sacerdote en la Misa.

RECEPCIÓN DE LA SANTA COMUNIÓN ... Solo un recordatorio

de que le pedimos que preferiblemente reciba la Sagrada Comunión en sus manos, sosteniendo ambas manos una encima de la otra. También recordar que la respuesta apropiada al sacerdote antes de recibir la Sagrada Comunión es "Amén", no "Gracias".

BAUTISMOS ... todos los católicos deben ser bautizados ... padres deben estar registrados en la parroquia y asistiendo a Misa los domingos semanalmente para tener al niño bautizado ... padrinos deben ser católicos practicantes que han recibido los sacramentos de Bautismo, Santa Comunión y Confirmación y, si casado, casado en la iglesia ... padrinos deben ser miembros de una parroquia y deben estar asistiendo a Misa semanalmente ... si va a ser un padrino, hace perfecto sentido y es razonable que usted este practicando la fe y que es un modelo para el niño.

SACRAMENTO DEL MATRIMONIO ... la Iglesia Católica nos enseña que el matrimonio es entre un hombre y una mujer, un signo de AMOR y VIDA ... Los católicos deben casarse en la iglesia y, si es casado sólo civilmente, debe hablar con uno de los sacerdotes acerca de recibir el sacramento en la iglesia (llamado convalidación) ... por favor saber que son bienvenidos para hacer preguntas y recibir dirección y consejos sobre el SACRAMENTO DEL MATRIMONIO ... Por favor recuerde de asegurar la fecha para su ceremonia antes de hacer cualquier arreglos con los proveedores, los conductores de la limosina, la familia y los amigos.

ARREGLOS FUNEBRES ... la práctica usual para entierros católicos es un servicio velatorio en una funeraria, una Misa Fúnebre en la iglesia parroquial, el entierro del cuerpo o restos en un cementerio (preferiblemente un cementerio católico) ... hablar con uno de los sacerdotes para asistencia antes que una muerte ocurra y hablar con un director acreditado de funeraria acerca de arreglos por adelantado ... los restos (las cenizas) deben recibir la misma reverencia y respeto como un cuerpo y por eso deben ser tratados con cuidado, respetuosamente, reverencialmente y enterrados tan pronto como sea posible después de la cremación.

REGISTRACION PARROQUIAL ... todos los miembros de la parroquia debe estar registrados y recibir correspondencia parroquial y los sobres ... si usted es un adulto (18 años y más), debe registrarse para recibir los sobres y otra información de la parroquia ... tienes que estar registrado para poder recibir cartas de recomendación, cartas financieras, precios de matriculación y otros temas relacionados con la parroquia ... ¿CÓMO REGISTRARSE? Llegar a la rectoría en Castle Hill Ave.

¿TARDE A LA IGLESIA? ... ¿Por qué? Por favor, arreglar llegar temprano a la misa, para orar, leer la Santa Escritura y estar listo cuando empezamos --- hará la misa más devota y significativa para todos ... Recuerde, si usted no oye las lecturas, usted no oye las enseñanzas de Cristo. San Jerónimo escribió, "Ignorar las Escrituras es ignorar a Cristo." Llegar a la iglesia a tiempo es importante.

VISITANDO A LOS ENFERMOS O los CONFINADOS EN LA CASA ... Si usted conoce a alguien que está enfermo o confinados en la casa que desean recibir la comunión, por favor llame a la rectoría y denos su información así como la información para aquellos que desean recibir la comunión. RESUMEN DEL MINISTERIO DE JESÚS

El relato de cómo Lázaro revivió de entre los muertos es el relato más largo (además de la Pasión) en el Evangelio según san Juan. En él encontramos un resumen de la mayor parte del ministerio de Jesús. Vemos su naturaleza humana cuando se conmueve con la tristeza de Marta y de María y cuando él mismo llora frente a la tumba de Lázaro. Es la sabiduría de la Palabra de Dios hecha carne cuando le explica a sus seguidores que la muerte de Lázaro servirá como una señal de la gloria de Dios. Corona los milagros que obra en el Evangelio según san Juan (que comenzó con el milagro más “humano” de hacer más vino en la boda de Caná) reviviendo a Lázaro de entre los muertos; un “avance”, por así decirlo, de su propia muerte y resurrección por venir. Este retrato de Jesús nos recuerda, mientras estamos cerca del fin de nuestro viaje de Cuaresma, que él está con nosotros, nos conoce, nos comprende en cada momento de nuestra vida. Conoce la alegría de nuestras celebraciones humanas, conoce la tristeza de nuestro llanto. Mientras nos preparamos para caminar con él en los días de Semana Santa, tenemos fe de que –por Cristo– la gloria de Dios estará con nosotros a cada momento de nuestra vida y –con Cristo– en nuestra vida eterna.

LECTURAS DE HOY

Primera lectura — Abriré sus tumbas; pondré mi espíritu en ustedes para que tengan vida (Ezequiel 37:12-14).
