

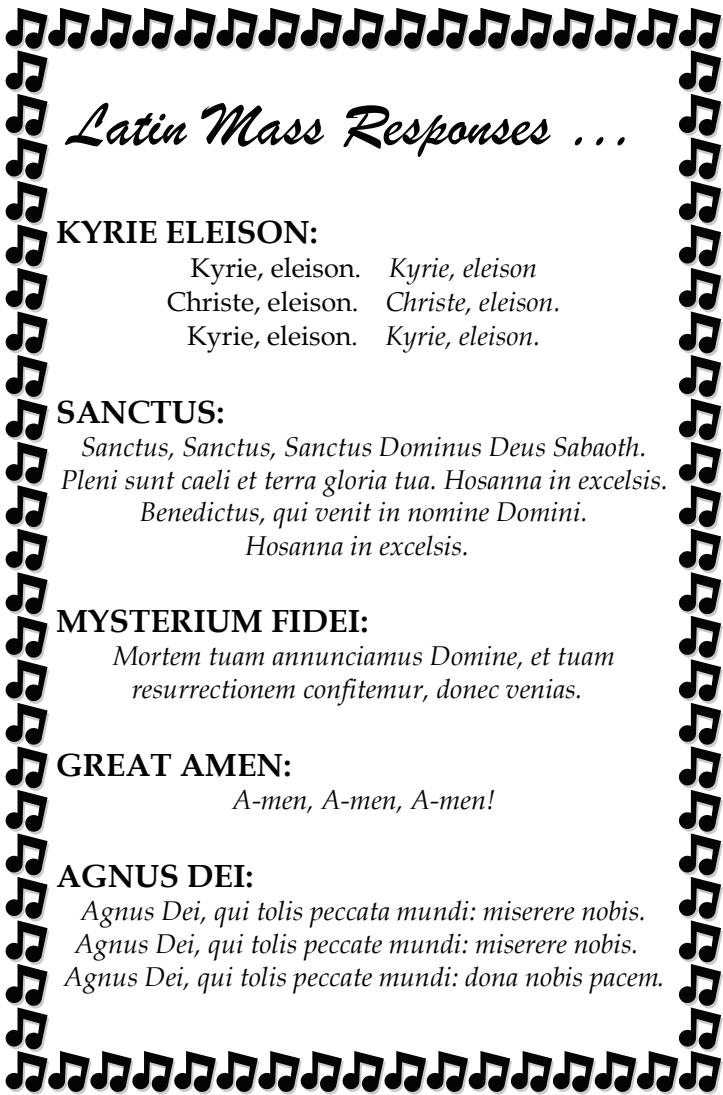

REJOICE AND BE GLAD

“This is the day the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad” (Psalm 118:24). Let us remember that these words of today’s responsorial psalm are not only sung from the hearts of those gathered in our parish. They are also sung by the poor in tiny barrios throughout Central and South America. They are sung by those denied religious freedom in our world; these Christians lift their voices in clandestine places of worship. These words are sung by people who have lost loved ones to acts of terrorism and war around the globe. Even in the midst of conflict and division, Christians still come together to declare that poverty, loneliness, violence, and division will never, ever have as much power as the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ. Indeed, let us rejoice this day and be glad!

OUR FAITH

The Eucharist: Food for Resurrection

How do we celebrate Easter, the greatest of our Christian feasts? By doing what we do every Sunday and every day: celebrating the Mass. On the first Easter, as the heartbroken disciples walked the road to Emmaus, the Lord was with them but they did not realize it. They only recognized him “in the breaking of the bread” (Luke 22:35).

It is the same for us. In the Mass—the breaking of the bread—we meet the risen Lord together. We meet him in each other—for by our baptism into his death and resurrection, we have become members of one body, the Body of Christ. We meet him in his word—in the liturgy the scriptures are proclaimed to us, that they might take root and grow in us. And we meet him in a special way in the Eucharist, the sacrament of his Body and Blood, which is food for resurrection: “whoever eats this bread will live forever” (John 6:51). The Lord is risen indeed, and it is the Risen One who truly presides at this and every Eucharist.

THE LORD IS RISEN ... Blessed Easter! I pray that Lent brought you closer to Our Lord, as it is meant to do. I hope that you walked with us during Holy Week, through the Church, following in steps of Jesus. Now you are here with your parish family, sharing the holiest day of our Catholic-Christian calendar. The priests, staff, and faculty of all things St. Raymond, thank you for all your prayers during Lent. Lent energizes our church, as we feel the presence of God all the more real when we share the one true faith as a family, God's family. Remember the Easter Season continues until Pentecost, so celebrate Jesus, and His glorious resurrection every day!

EASTER COLLECTION FOR THE CHURCH AND THE EASTER FLOWER COLLECTION ... envelopes are in your packets ... thanks for your generosity once again.

EASTER WEEK MASSES ... A reminder that there is no 7AM Mass during Easter Week (April 6-April 10).

RECTORY OFFICES ... on Monday, April 6 the Rectory Offices will be closed ... there will be Mass in St. Raymonds Chapel at 9 am and 12 noon.

IN CHURCH ... are you texting or praying ... are you playing games or reading the Bible selections for the Sunday? Leave the phone in your pocket, put it off and ENJOY some quality time with God in church!

NEW AD SPONSORS ... please notice the businesses that are supporting our weekly bulletin ... we are grateful to the many businesses and offices that advertise and support the printing of our Sunday bulletin ... please consider patronizing them and tell them you saw their ad in our Sunday bulletin.

AS ALWAYS ... a reminder about arriving early --- or at least, on time --- for Mass ... Jesus deserves our complete attention from the beginning of the Mass until the end ... on time for the Masses on Saturday at 5:30 pm or 7 pm and Sunday at 7:30 am, 9 am, 10:30 am, and 12 noon.

PARKING ... please be courteous ... do not use two spaces ... do not block other cars ... both parking lots are open --- on Castle Hill and on Purdy Street.

CREMATION ... as Catholics, we have permission of the church to be cremated ... the procedure for the funeral is: WAKE SERVICE WITH THE BODY, FUNERAL MASS WITH THE BODY, CREMATION and burial as soon as possible after the cremation ... we should not save the ashes at home, bring them to the beach or the mountains or leave them in the funeral home ... the ashes are to be treated with respect and dignity like a body and be buried as soon as possible after the cremation.

MASS INTENTIONS ... you can remember a family member or friend with an intention at a specific Mass come to the rectory for a specific date ... the offering is \$15 and Mass cards are available with each Mass ... the intentions can be for a living or deceased person ... intentions are printed in the bulletin.

RECEPTION OF HOLY COMMUNION ... Just a reminder that we ask that you preferably receive Holy Communion in your hands, by holding out both hands one on top of the other. Also remember that the proper response to the priest before receiving Holy Communion is "Amen," not "Thank you."

BAPTISMS ... all Catholics should be baptized ... parents should be registered in the parish and attending weekly Sunday Mass in order to have the child baptized ... godparents must be practicing

Catholics who have received the sacraments of Baptism, Holy Communion and Confirmation and, if married, married in the church ... godparents must be members of a parish and must be attending weekly Mass ... if you are going to be a godparent, it makes perfect and reasonable sense that you are practicing the faith and that you are a model for the child.

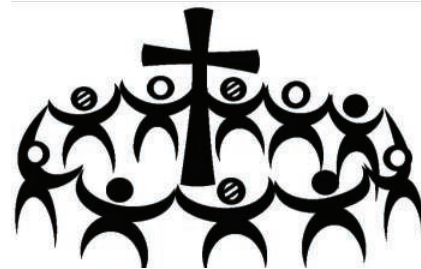
SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY ... the Catholic Church teaches that marriage is between a man and a woman, a sign of LOVE and LIFE ... Catholics should be married in the church and, if married only civilly, should speak to one of the priests about receiving the sacrament in the Church (called convalidation) ... please know that you are welcome to ask questions and to receive direction and advice about the SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY ... Please remember to secure a date for your wedding before making any arrangements with caterers, limo drivers, family and friends.

FUNERAL ARRANGEMENTS ... the usual practice for Catholic burials is a wake service in a funeral home, a Funeral Mass in the parish church, burial of the body or cremains in a cemetery (preferably a Catholic cemetery) ... speak with one of the priests for assistance before a death occurs and speak with a reputable funeral home director about pre-arrangements ... cremains (ashes) are held in the same reverence and respect as a body and so they should be treated carefully, respectfully, reverentially and buried as soon as possible after cremation.

PARISH REGISTRATION ... all members of the parish should be registered and receive parish mailings and envelopes ... if you are an adult (18 years and older), you should register to receive the envelopes and other information from the parish ... you need to be registered in order to receive recommendation letters, financial statements, tuition rates and other parish related issues ... HOW TO REGISTER? Come to the rectory office on Castle Hill Ave.

LATE FOR CHURCH? ... Why? Please resolve to arrive early for Mass, say a prayer, read the Scripture and be ready when we start it will make the Mass more prayerful and meaningful for all. Remember, if you miss the readings, you miss the teachings of Christ. St. Jerome wrote, "Ignorance of Scripture is ignorance of Christ." Getting to Church on time matters.

VISITING OF THE SICK OR HOMEBOUND ... If you know of anyone who is sick or homebound and would like to receive communion, Please call the rectory to give us your information as well as the information of the person who wishes to receive communion. They must reside in our parish area.

EL SEÑOR HA RESUCITADO ... ¡Bendita Pascua! Ruego que la Cuaresma le haya acercado a Nuestro Señor, como se supone que debe ser. Espero que haya caminado con nosotros durante la Semana Santa, a través de la Iglesia, siguiendo los pasos de Jesús. Ahora está aquí con su familia parroquial, compartiendo el día más sagrado de nuestro calendario católico-cristiano. Los sacerdotes, el personal y la facultad de todas las cosas en San Ramón, les dan las gracias por todas sus oraciones durante la Cuaresma. La Cuaresma da energía a nuestra iglesia, ya que sentimos la presencia de Dios mucho más real cuando compartimos la única fe verdadera como familia, la familia de Dios. Recordar que la temporada de Pascua continúa hasta Pentecostés, ¡así que a celebrar a Jesús y su gloriosa resurrección todos los días!

COLECCIÓN DE PASCUA DE LA IGLESIA Y LA COLECCIÓN DE FLORES DE PASCUA ... sobres están en sus paquetes ... gracias por su generosidad, una vez más.

MISAS DURANTE LA SEMANA DE PASCUA ... Un recordatorio de que no hay misa de las 7 am durante la Semana de Pascua (del 6 de abril hasta el 10 de abril).

LA RECTORIA ... el lunes, 6 de abril las Oficinas de la Rectoría estarán cerradas. Habrá misa en la capilla de San Ramon a las 9am y 12 del mediodía.

EN LA IGLESIA ... estás enviando mensajes de texto o rezando ... estás jugando juegos o leyendo las selecciones de la Biblia para el domingo? Dejar el teléfono en el bolsillo, apagar el teléfono y DISFRUTAR de un tiempo de calidad con Dios en la iglesia!

NUEVOS PATROCINADORES DE ANUNCIOS ... por favor notar los negocios que están apoyando nuestro boletín semanal ... estamos agradecidos a los muchos negocios y oficinas que se anuncian y apoyan la impresión de nuestro boletín de los domingos ... por favor considerar apoyarlos y decirles que usted vio su anuncio en nuestro boletín del domingo.

COMO SIEMPRE ... un recordatorio acerca de llegar temprano --- o al menos, a tiempo --- para la misa ... Jesús merece toda nuestra atención desde el principio de la misa hasta el final ... a tiempo para las misas los sábados a las 5:30 pm o 7:00 pm y los domingos a las 7:30 am, 9 am, 10:30 am, y 12 del mediodía.

PARQUEO ... por favor sea cortés ... no use dos espacios ... no bloquear otros coches ... ambos parqueos están abiertos --- en Castle Hill y en Purdy Street.

CREMACIÓN ... como católicos, tenemos el permiso de la iglesia para ser cremados ... el procedimiento para el funeral es: VELORIO CON EL CUERPO, MISA FUNERAL CON EL CUERPO, CREMACIÓN y entierro lo más pronto posible después de la cremación ... no debemos guardar las cenizas en el hogar, llevar a la playa o la montañas o dejar en la funeraria ... las cenizas deben ser tratadas con respeto y dignidad como un cuerpo y ser enterradas tan pronto como sea posible después de la cremación.

INTENCIONES DE LA MISA ... usted puede recordar un miembro de la familia o amigo con una intención en una Misa específica ... venir a la rectoría para una fecha específica ... la ofrenda es \$15 y tarjetas de la Misa están disponibles con cada Misa ... las intenciones pueden ser para una persona viva o difunta ... intenciones son impresas en el boletín, colocados en el altar y mencionadas por el sacerdote en la Misa.

RECEPCIÓN DE LA SANTA COMUNIÓN ... Solo un recordatorio de que le pedimos que preferiblemente reciba la Sagrada Comunión en sus manos, sosteniendo ambas manos una

encima de la otra. También recordar que la respuesta apropiada al sacerdote antes de recibir la Sagrada Comunión es "Amén", no "Gracias".

BAUTISMOS ... todos los católicos deben ser bautizados ... padres deben estar registrados en la parroquia y asistiendo a Misa los domingos semanalmente para tener al niño bautizado ... padrinos deben ser católicos practicantes que han recibido los sacramentos de Bautismo, Santa Comunión y Confirmación y, si casado, casado en la iglesia ... padrinos deben ser miembros de una parroquia y deben estar asistiendo a Misa semanalmente ... si va a ser un padrino, hace perfecto sentido y es razonable que usted este practicando la fe y que es un modelo para el niño.

SACRAMENTO DEL MATRIMONIO ... la Iglesia Católica nos enseña que el matrimonio es entre un hombre y una mujer, un signo de AMOR y VIDA ... Los católicos deben casarse en la iglesia y, si es casado sólo civilmente, debe hablar con uno de los sacerdotes acerca de recibir el sacramento en la iglesia (llamado convalidación) ... por favor saber que son bienvenidos para hacer preguntas y recibir dirección y consejos sobre el SACRAMENTO DEL MATRIMONIO ... Por favor recuerde de asegurar la fecha para su ceremonia antes de hacer cualquier arreglos con los proveedores, los conductores de la limosina, la familia y los amigos.

ARREGLOS FUNEBRES ... la práctica usual para entierros católicos es un servicio velatorio en una funeraria, una Misa Fúnebre en la iglesia parroquial, el entierro del cuerpo o restos en un cementerio (preferiblemente un cementerio católico) ... hablar con uno de los sacerdotes para asistencia antes que una muerte ocurra y hablar con un director acreditado de funeraria acerca de arreglos por adelantado ... los restos (las cenizas) deben recibir la misma reverencia y respeto como un cuerpo y por eso deben ser tratados con cuidado, respetuosamente, reverencialmente y enterrados tan pronto como sea posible después de la cremación.

REGISTRACION PARROQUIAL ... todos los miembros de la parroquia debe estar registrados y recibir correspondencia parroquial y los sobres ... si usted es un adulto (18 años y más), debe registrarse para recibir los sobres y otra información de la parroquia ... tienes que estar registrado para poder recibir cartas de recomendación, cartas financieras, precios de matriculación y otros temas relacionados con la parroquia ... ¿CÓMO REGISTRARSE? Llegar a la rectoría en Castle Hill Ave.

¿TARDE A LA IGLESIA? ... ¿Por qué? Por favor, arreglar llegar temprano a la misa, para orar, leer la Santa Escritura y estar listo cuando empezamos --- hará la misa más devota y significativa para todos ... Recuerde, si usted no oye las lecturas, usted no oye las enseñanzas de Cristo. San Jerónimo escribió, "Ignorar las Escrituras es ignorar a Cristo." Llegar a la iglesia a tiempo es importante.

VISITANDO A LOS ENFERMOS O los CONFINADOS EN LA CASA ... Si usted conoce a alguien que está enfermo o confinados en la casa que desean recibir la comunión, por favor llame a la rectoría y denos su información así como la información para aquellos que desean recibir la comunión. Deben de residir en nuestra área parroquial.

Incluso en medio del conflicto y la división, los cristianos nos unimos para declarar que la pobreza, la soledad, la violencia y la división nunca jamás tendrán tanto poder como la Vida, la Muerte y la Resurrección de Jesucristo. Sin duda, ¡regocijémonos este día y alegrémonos!

NUESTRA FE

La Eucaristía: Alimento para la Resurrección

¿Cómo celebramos la Pascua, la mayor de nuestras fiestas cristianas? Haciendo lo que hacemos cada domingo y cada día: celebrando la Misa. En la primera Pascua, mientras los discípulos, desconsolados, caminaban hacia Emaús, el Señor estaba con ellos, pero ellos no se dieron cuenta. Solo lo reconocieron «al partir el pan» (Lc 22,35).

Lo mismo ocurre con nosotros. En la Misa —la fracción del pan— nos encontramos juntos con el Señor resucitado. Lo encontramos los unos en los otros, pues por nuestro bautismo en su muerte y resurrección, nos hemos convertido en miembros de un solo cuerpo, el Cuerpo de Cristo. Lo encontramos en su palabra: en la Liturgia se nos proclaman las Escrituras para que arraiguen y crezcan en nosotros. Y lo encontramos de manera especial en la Eucaristía, el sacramento de su Cuerpo y Sangre, que es alimento para la resurrección: «El que come de este pan vivirá para siempre» (Jn 6,51). El Señor verdaderamente ha resucitado, y es el Resucitado quien verdaderamente preside esta y toda Eucaristía.

OUR LADY OF HOPE CREMATION GARDEN
NOW OPEN AT ST. RAYMOND'S CEMETERY

Cremation is permitted by the Catholic Church and Catholics are reminded that the cremains (ashes) are to be treated with respect and dignity. Cremains should be buried immediately after a Funeral Mass and should never be displayed or stored in an urn at home or sprinkled over land or water. Just as a body is reverently buried on Holy grounds after a Funeral Mass so, too, should cremains be buried reverently with prayer and Holy Water.
