# Be a Digital Disciple on social media



## 👍 *Accompany People with Joy!*

Social media are great tools to spread the Gospel. Use them to accompany others. Follow the USCCB daily on Facebook, Twitter, and Instagram, and share posts to spread the joy of our faith.

## 👍 *Would I Say This in Person?*

If you get angry, take a break to think about what you'd say face-to-face. Are your words loving and merciful? If you're upset, don't reply right away. Walk away from the device. Ask yourself what you'd say in person.

## 👍 *Create Networks of Encounter*

Behind the wires and screens are people. Use social media to share affirming stories and encounter others. Be authentic and build community. Offer to pray for each other or share a favorite prayer.

## **The unvarnished truth**

The apostle James, whose feast we celebrate July 25, was the first of the Twelve to be martyred (beheaded by order of King Herod in 44 AD). Because of their zeal, Jesus called James and his brother John (the evangelist) the "Sons of Thunder." James' New Testament letter contains "tough-love" teaching on a variety of subjects, including gossip "No human being can tame the tongue; it is a restless evil, full of deadly poison" (3:8), temptation, sin, and faith and works. The Letter of James serves well as an examination of conscience. But it also holds the basis for our Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick. Read these simple and tender words: "Is anyone among you sick? He should summon the [priests] of the church, and they should pray over him and anoint him with oil in the name of the Lord, and the prayer of faith will save the sick person, and the Lord will raise him up. If he has committed any sins, he will be forgiven" (5:14-15). *St James, pray for us to love as generously as you!*
