

From Our Pastor: IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE SCRIPTURES:

REFLECTIONS ON POPE BENEDICT XVI'S *VERBUM DOMINI*

if you remember last week, I mentioned that Jesus was the pink elephant, this new thing in God's self-revelation to us because He became one of us. Then, He died, or rather, chose to die, "the true sacrificial lamb who brings about our definitive liberation from slavery," (VD, 12). He changes the conversation by being the translator. He unites what has been divided since the original sin, but He unites God and man in an even more definitive relationship than Adam and Eve and God. He destroys death and rises to restore life, bringing light into the world inhabited by the darkness of sin. King David sang, "Your word is a lamp to my feet and a light to my path," (Psalm 119:105). It is Christ who is this light, through His resurrection. "From the beginning Christians realized that in Christ the word of God is present in a person. The word of God is the true light than men and women need. In the resurrection the Son of God truly emerges as the light of the world. Now, by living with him and in him, we can live in the light," (VD, 12). His Paschal Mystery, Christ's death and resurrection, is the definitive message of God. It is the heart of God's revelation of Himself to man. Here's where it gets even deeper. The Paschal Mystery is the fulfillment of the Old Testament. St Paul says, "For I delivered to you as of first importance what I also received, that Christ died for our sins in accordance with the Scriptures, that he was buried, that he was raised on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures" (1 Corinthians 15:3-4). The words of the Old Testament find flesh in Jesus. Each prophecy spoken is incarnated in Him. The words become reality, the virgin bears a child (Isaiah 7:4), the suffering servant (Isaiah 50-54), the son of David to be the Son of God (1 Samuel 7:12-13), the paschal lamb whose blood saves the Jews from death (Exodus 12:3-11), the prophet who is to come (Deuteronomy 18:15,18). promised comes to life in Christ. "In other words, this death which took place 'in accordance with the Scriptures' is an event containing a logos, an inner logic: the death of Christ testifies that the word of God became thoroughly human 'flesh,' human 'history,'" (VD, 13). It's just as I said, it's as if the word 'pink elephant' conjured up the real thing. Only, there is no magic, and there is no 'as if.' What this means is, "The Son of Man recapitulates in himself earth and heaven, creation and the creator, flesh and Spirit. He is the centre of the cosmos and of history, for in him converge without confusion the author and his work," (VD, 13).


