REFLECTIONS ON POPE BENEDICT XVI'S *VERBUM DOMINI*: RECAPITULATION

I left you last week with a somewhat confusing quote from Pope Benedict: "The Son of Man recapitulates in himself earth and heaven, creation and the creator, flesh and Spirit. He is the center of the cosmos and history, for in him converge without confusion the author and his work," (VD, 13). "Recapitulate" and its other forms isn't a word we use in regular, everyday language. It felt right that I should explain it.

Merriam-Webster defines recapitulation as "a concise summary." It means to return to something, review it, repeat it in more direct fashion. It has a deeper meaning in theology which stems from Ephesians 1:9-10: "He has made known to us the mystery of his will in accord with his favor that he set forth in him as a plan for the fullness of time, to sum up all things in Christ, in heaven and on earth." St Paul tells us that *all things are summed up in Christ*.

St Irenaeus, an early Church Father, takes this and opens it up. *All things* is the key. It includes humans who experienced something new in the Incarnation. The King of Heaven became the King of Earth. "The coming together of all being in Christ, the centre of time and space, gradually takes place in history, as the obstacles, the resistance of sin and the Evil One, are overcome."¹ It's difficult to understand, so St Irenaeus uses the example St Paul uses in Romans 5:12-21, where he describes Jesus as the New Adam. Adam's sin was disobedience, and from it, all the world experienced corruption and death. "Christ is the new Adam, that is, the Firstborn of faithful humanity, who lovingly and obediently welcomes the plan of redemption which God designed as the soul and goal of history. Christ must cancel the work of devastation, the horrible idolatries, violence and every sin that rebellious Adam sowed in the age-old history of humanity and in the created realm... In himself he 'recapitulates' Adam, in whom all humanity can see itself, transforms him into a child of God and restores him to full communion with the Father."²

Jesus' obedience to the Father undoes death for man, turning it from condemnation into exaltation. The temptation of Christ and his resistance undoes our failure and gives us strength to conform ourselves to the new Adam, Christ. Each moment of his life opened up new avenues of grace for us, which

before were dammed up by sin. "Therefore, the full realization of the Creator's original plan emerges: that of a creation in which God and man, man and woman, humanity and nature are in harmony, in dialogue, and in communion. This plan, upset by sin, is restored in the most marvelous way by Christ, who mysteriously but effectively carries it out in the present reality, waiting to bring it to fulfillment."³
