

2024 Prom Information and Expectations

Prom will be held on Saturday, May 4th, 2024. The times, locations, and information given are to guide attendees in making plans to prepare for purchasing tickets and attending all prom events. Attendees must attend mass in order to attend the remainder of events.

We are excited to offer a night filled with dinner, music and dancing, and unlimited play with food and drinks at Stardust for the estimated all-inclusive price of \$110 per person. The ticket cost includes everything for the night and was able to be maintained at the same price as last year.

Due to Easter, Spring Break, and deadlines for planning prom events, tickets will be sold in person at lunch April 10th and 11th but will be available for purchase online starting March 25th running through April 12th. Table seating will be determined at a later date.

Guest forms are available at any time in the Main Office for non-NCC guest or recent Nouvel Alumni and must be approved before ticket purchase. Therefore, students should plan ahead and get approval by the end of March.

Families of the Prom attendees are encouraged to attend Mass with their students.

Expectations & Dress Code

Students' appearance at prom should be modest and keeping with the Christian values of our community. When determining the appropriateness of dresses/suits, please keep in mind that students will be dancing, moving around and sitting – not standing still. In an effort to create an environment that is comfortable for all students, dance attendees must conduct themselves in an appropriate manner. Therefore, with safety, comfort and modesty in mind, the dress code guidelines below are required to be followed at the Prom events for Nouvel Catholic Central High School.

The chaperones and administration reserve the right to make the final decision on the dress code and behavioral expectations of attendees. <u>Students not properly attired may not be permitted to participate in prom events and will not be issued a refund.</u> If you are not sure about the appropriateness of planned attire, please check with Mr. Marshall and Ms. Wagner.

Once a student is checked in at prom and post prom, they are not allowed to leave and come back.

Mass, Dinner, and Dance:

Ladies:

- Dresses may be sleeveless, spaghetti strap, one shoulder or strapless.
- Dresses may be long, ankle length or short (no more than 4 inches above the knee)
- Dresses may not have plunging necklines, exposed cleavage, visible midriffs, cutouts below the traditional bra line, or sheer material allowing skin to show.
- Dress backs must hit above the small of your back (approx. at the bottom of the ribcage).
- Dresses may not have a slit more than four inches above the knee while standing.
- No pinning will be allowed as an alteration for a dress if, without the pins, the dress does not
 meet dress code. Fabric inserts must be sewn, not pinned, on the dress if, without the inserts,
 the dress does not meet dress code.
- Cover-ups (coats, shawls, sweaters) must be worn during mass.

Gentlemen:

- Tuxedo or dress suit including tie, bow tie, collared shirt, turtleneck, or vest.
- Leather dress shoes and socks are required.
- If you are wearing a hat, it may not be worn in church.

Post Prom:

At Post Prom students are expected to following the dress code of a spirit day or comfy day as indicated in the Nouvel Student Handbook. Students are expected to attend post prom festivities and will not be released early. <u>Students must plan accordingly to be able to change into post prom clothing between the dance and post prom as it may not be feasible for them to travel home to do so. For safety and security, all bags will be checked at post prom.</u>
