AP EXAM REGISTRATION

As we plan ahead for the remainder of the school year, it is time to start thinking about whether or not you/your student intends to take their AP Examination for each course



they are currently taking. Each AP Exam is \$99; however, College Board does offer financial support for students who meet fee reduction eligibility (see below), reducing the cost, if criteria are met (see below).

Registration and Payment are due October 24, 2025.

Students who are taking AP Macroeconomics (semester 2 only) do not have to register or pay for their test until February 26.

How to Register for AP Exams:

- 1. Students are automatically "registered" to take the AP exam and must opt out by sending me an email that includes the exam they wish to opt out of. If you intend to take all of your exams, you can proceed to step 2.
- 2. Once you have confirmed your exam(s), submit payment (\$99) online: www.nouvelcatholic.org/aptest.
 - o If a student changes their mind prior to February 26, they will be able to cancel their registration and receive a partial refund by sending me an email request. Cancellations after February 26 will not be refunded.

*Fee Reduction Eligibility criteria include any one of the following: The student is enrolled in a federal, state, or local program that aids students from low-income families (e.g., Federal TRIO programs such as Upward Bound). The student's family receives public assistance. The student resides in federally subsidized public housing or a foster home or is unhoused. The student is a vard of the state or an orphan.
