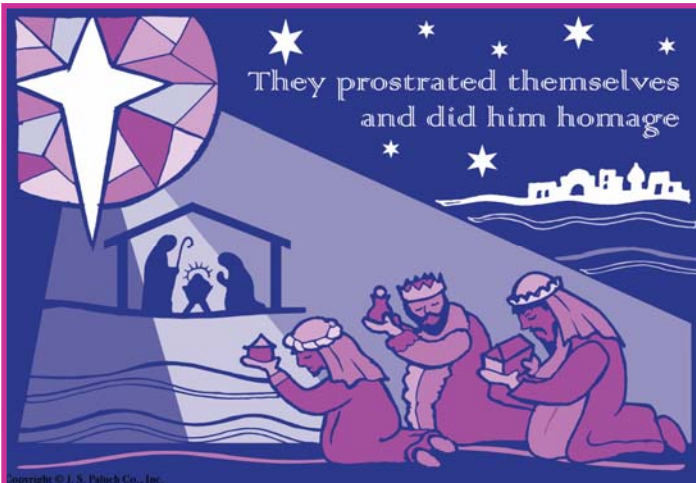

SOLEMNITY OF THE EPIPHANY OF THE LORD

JOURNEY TOWARD GOD

In our celebration of the Epiphany, two interwoven themes are present in the readings today. God is beginning something new, and God gathers all of humanity to participate. For Isaiah, God's bright light, manifested in the people of Israel, attracts and summons people from many nations to Jerusalem. In the letter to the Ephesians, God's grace makes the Gentiles co-heirs and co-partners in the gospel. Matthew tells the story of the fulfillment of God's promises to Israel through the birth of Jesus, and simultaneously leading foreigners to share in these same promises. With the birth of Jesus, God chose a particular people, in a particular time and place, to enter most directly into the human story.

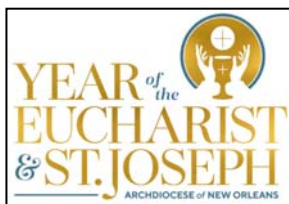
Today's readings teach that God did this in order to gather all people, all cultures, into unity with God. Like the magi, we are drawn into a journey toward God, becoming co-partners in God's work.

Monthly Explanation of the Mass

Blessing and Dismissal

Having been fed by the Lord from the table of His living Word and from the altar of His Body and Blood, the celebration of the Mass draws to a close in a way similar to how we began, namely, with the Sign of the Cross – the priest does this by invoking the blessing of Almighty God (the Father, and the Son, and the Holy Spirit) while making the Sign of the Cross over the people in blessing.

People and things are blessed for a purpose. When God called Abraham, God blessed him so that he would be a blessing to all families of the earth (Genesis 12). For us as Christian people, blessing takes on new significance with Christ in and through whom we have been baptized and become sharers in the Divine life: “it is no longer I who live, but Christ who lives in me” (Galatians 2:20).

This powerful truth of Divine life within us is precisely why the *Catechism* states clearly that “every baptized person is called to be a blessing and to bless” (CCC, 1669). The blessing of Almighty God, therefore, is invoked at the end of Mass to further aid us in our identity/call to be a blessing – to allow Christ to live and act more fully through us in our daily lives.

Immediately following the blessing, the deacon (or priest) proclaims the dismissal, which always begins with the word GO! – just as the risen Christ sent his disciples, so He now sends us (Mt 28:20). In fact, our whole celebration of worship gets its name *Mass* from the dismissal (*Ite missa est* – Go, you are dismissed/sent), but we have not gathered simply to be sent; it is only after we have encountered Christ alive among us and have been nourished by Him (through Word and Sacrament) that we are blessed and sent to live what we have just celebrated, to fulfill God's will in our daily lives (CCC, 1332).

SOLEMNIDAD DE LA EPIFANÍA DEL SEÑOR

CAMINO HACIA DIOS

En nuestra celebración de la Epifanía, dos temas entrelazados están presentes en las lecturas de hoy. Dios está comenzando algo nuevo, y Dios reúne a toda la humanidad a participar. Para Isaías, la luz brillante de Dios, manifestada en el pueblo de Israel, atrae y convoca a personas de muchas naciones a Jerusalén. En la carta a los efesios, la gracia de Dios hace a los gentiles coherederos y en el Evangelio de Mateo los hace coparticipes. Mateo cuenta la historia del cumplimiento de las promesas de Dios a Israel por medio del nacimiento de Jesús, y simultáneamente guiando a los extranjeros a compartir esas mismas promesas. Con el nacimiento de Jesús, Dios eligió a un pueblo determinado, en un tiempo y lugares específicos, para entrar directamente en la historia de la humanidad.

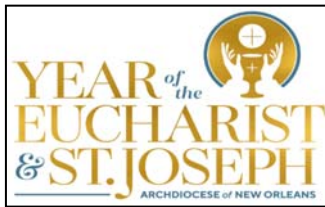

Explicación mensual de la misa

Bendición y Despedida

- Habiendo sido alimentados por el Señor de la mesa de su Palabra viva y del altar de su Cuerpo y Sangre, la celebración de la Misa llega a su fin de manera similar a como comenzamos, es decir, con la Señal de la Cruz. - el sacerdote hace esto invocando la bendición de Dios Todopoderoso (el Padre, el Hijo y el Espíritu Santo) mientras hace la Señal de la Cruz sobre el pueblo en bendición.
- Las personas y las cosas son bendecidas con un propósito. Cuando Dios llamó a Abraham, Dios lo bendijo para que fuera una bendición para todas las familias de la tierra (Génesis 12). Para nosotros, como pueblo cristiano, la bendición adquiere un nuevo significado con Cristo en y por quien hemos sido bautizados y nos convertimos en partícipes de la vida divina: “ya no vivo yo, sino Cristo quien vive en mí” (Gálatas 2:20).
- Esta poderosa verdad de la vida divina en nosotros es precisamente la razón por la que el Catecismo dice claramente que “todo bautizado está llamado a ser bendición y a bendecir” (CIC, 1669). La bendición de Dios Todopoderoso, por lo tanto, se invoca al final de la Misa para ayudarnos más en nuestra identidad / llamado a ser una bendición, para permitir que Cristo viva y actúe más plenamente a través de nosotros en nuestra vida diaria.
- Inmediatamente después de la bendición, el diácono (o sacerdote) proclama la despedida, que siempre comienza con la palabra ¡VAYA! - así como Cristo resucitado envió a sus discípulos, así ahora nos envía a nosotros (Mt 28, 20). De hecho, toda nuestra celebración de culto recibe su nombre de Misa de la despedida (Ite missa est - Ve, eres despedido / enviado), pero no nos hemos reunido simplemente para ser enviados; es solo después de haber encontrado a Cristo vivo entre nosotros y haber sido nutridos por Él (a través de la Palabra y el Sacramento) que somos bendecidos y enviados a vivir lo que acabamos de celebrar, para cumplir la voluntad de Dios en nuestra vida diaria (CIC, 1332).

WHAT KIND OF GOD IS THIS?

Christmas is a season of abundance. Christmas cookies and carols. Parties and presents. Mangers and misletoe. The same is true in our church. Within a period of nine days we celebrate Christmas, the Holy Family, Mary Mother of God, and today the Solemnity of the Epiphany. Truly an embarrassment of liturgical riches. (And we are not finished yet!)

However, for many people, Christmas is already over.

Trees litter the curbside or make their way back to the attic. Presents are put away or returned. We prepare to go back to school or work. But as Christians we have barely dipped our toes into the profound mystery of a God who walks among us. What kind of a God is this whose kingdom is not limited by our borders, fears, expectations, or imaginations? Today's psalm reminds us, "Lord, every nation on earth will adore you." Diversity and inclusion are not new to God's agenda.

TRADITIONS UNCOVER MEANING

Two traditional rituals, one liturgical and one domestic, help underline the meaning of the Epiphany. The

Proclamation of the Date of Easter is an option for inclusion at Mass today. This text which formally announces the dates of the upcoming major feast days reminds us that Christmas is best honored in the context of the whole story of salvation that culminates in Easter. Or as writer Nathan Mitchell reflects, the wood of the crib becomes the wood of the cross.

The second tradition connected to Epiphany is the blessing of the door of one's home with chalk. It includes a prayer for protection for all who enter therein. One explanation of this tradition ties it to the Passover in the Book of Exodus: the marking of the doorposts with the blood of the lamb kept the Israelites safe. This tradition too offers a connection between Christmas and Easter.

As we continue to mine the richness of this season we hum along with the angels, Gloria in excelsis Deo!

QUÉ CLASE DE DIOS ES ESTE?

La Navidad es una temporada de abundancia. Galletas navideñas y villancicos. Fiestas y regalos. Pesebres y muérdago. Lo mismo ocurre en nuestra iglesia. En un período de nueve días celebramos la Navidad, la Sagrada Familia, María Madre de Dios, y hoy la Solemnidad de la Epifanía. Un verdadero cúmulo de riquezas litúrgicas. LAS TRADICIONES DESCUBREN EL SIGNIFICADO

Dos rituales tradicionales, uno litúrgico y otro doméstico, ayudan a subrayar el significado de la Epifanía. La Proclamación de la fecha de la Pascua es una opción para incluir en la Misa de hoy. Este texto que anuncia formalmente las fechas de las próximas fiestas mayores nos recuerda que la Navidad se honra mejor en el contexto de toda la historia de la salvación que culmina en la Pascua. O como reflexiona el escritor Nathan Mitchell, la madera del pesebre se convierte en la madera de la cruz.

La segunda tradición relacionada con la Epifanía es la bendición de la puerta de la casa con tiza o gis. Incluye una oración de protección para todos los que entran en ella. Una de las explicaciones de esta tradición la relaciona con la Pascua en el libro del Éxodo: marcar los postes de la puerta con la sangre del cordero mantenía a salvo a los israelitas. Esta tradición también ofrece una conexión entre la Navidad y la Pascua. Mientras continuamos extrayendo la riqueza de esta temporada, tarareamos junto con los ángeles: ¡Gloria in excelsis Deo!
