OCTOBER - MONTH OF THE HOLY ROSARY

In October, we celebrate a well-loved memorial in honor of the Rosary, and according to a long-standing tradition, the entire month of October is dedicated to the Most Holy Rosary. In the Rosary, with its sequence of prayers and mysteries, we contemplate the Gospel in company with the Blessed Virgin Mary. As Blessed Pope John Paul II wrote in 2002, "the Rosary…is a prayer loved by countless Saints and encouraged by the Magisterium. Simple yet profound, it still remains, at the dawn of this third millennium, a prayer of great significance, destined to bring forth a harvest of holiness…. With the Rosary, the Christian people sit at the school of Mary and are led to contemplate the beauty on the face of Christ and to experience the depths of his love. Through the Rosary, the faithful receive abundant grace, as though from the very hands of the Mother of the Redeemer" (Rosarium Virginis Mariae, 1).

We welcome any visitors, including those who may not be of our Catholic faith. We pray that our celebration of the sacred liturgy today was a meaningful one for you.

SACRAMENTS

<u>Baptism</u> - A preparation class is required of the parents requesting Baptism for their first child. Parents and godparents are encouraged to attend the class before the baby's birth. (Scheduled as needed.)

<u>Confirmation</u> - Confirmation is celebrated in the spring with students who are at least in the 8th grade and have completed the requirements for the preparation process in our PRE program.

<u>Matrimony</u> - Couples planning to marry should contact the Pastor at least 5 months prior to the proposed date so all parish and diocesan requirements may be completed.

<u>Holy Orders</u> - If you feel called to a vocation in the priesthood or religious life, please contact the pastor.

<u>Anointing of the Sick</u> - If you wish to receive this sacrament, contact the pastor. If there is an emergency situation, an immediate family member should contact the pastor.

OCTOBER – Month of the Holy Rosary

In today's Gospel, Jesus speaks about the indissoluble bond of man and wife in the sacrament of Marriage. For this reason, divorce is not permitted because the union between the man and woman remains intact by virtue of their vows to one another. In this way, the Church supports and protects the dignity of the sacrament of Marriage by continuing to teach and promote the total gift of self in love and forgiveness toward one spouse, which results in fruitfulness and holiness among families and marriages.

FIRST READING (Genesis 2:18-24) God has deigned that human creatures need not be alone. Neither the animals nor the birds were "suitable partner[s]" (Genesis 2:18) for the human creature even though named by him. "Suitable partners" are "like" one another, of the same flesh and bone. Only in one another do man and woman find a suitable partner. In their union with one another, the two become one flesh.

Genesis presents us with the image of a person alone and helpless. To resolve the problem, God puts the man into a sleep so deep that he cannot watch what is going to happen. Then, having created the woman, God presents her to the man, almost like the father of the bride escorting a daughter to her groom. The man expresses his delight as he repeats: this one, this one, this one! The point is that it is not good for a person to be alone. Human beings are social by nature. We are created to be partners and helpers one for another.

RESPONSORIAL PSALM (Psalm 128:1-2, 3, 4-5, 6) We might think of Psalm 128 as a family Psalm (note the references to wife and children). The Lord's blessing is manifest in the gifts of prosperity and descendants. Happiness is rooted in fear and reverence of the Lord.

Praying this psalm leads us to recapture the joy of that garden where God created humanity.

SECOND READING (Hebrews 2:9-11) Though not chosen for a connection with the other readings. Hebrews emphasizes that Jesus became like us—a true brother even to the point of death. Jesus is our leader in salvation.

The author admits that Jesus was, for a time, less than the angels, and immediately explains why that was so. Jesus chose inferiority to the angels precisely so that he could be one with humanity in all things, including death. Adding an exceptional development to the teaching of Genesis, Hebrews asserts that in the person of Jesus, God became one with humanity to consecrate us, to be brother and helper to us.

GOSPEL (Mark 10:2-16 or 10:2-12) Jesus asks for something more than what the law required. According to the law of Moses, divorce was permissible. According to the teaching of Jesus, it is not. It is God who has joined man and woman together as husband and wife.

In this scene, we find the Pharisees trying to put Jesus in danger or trap him in legalities. The danger came from the fact that John the Baptist had been beheaded over the question of divorce (Mark 6:17-29). While that lurked in the background, rabbis of that day debated the legitimacy of divorce. As so often happened, rather than answer the Pharisees' question, Jesus asked one of his own and, as usual, caught them in their own trap.

REFLECTION Jesus reminds us that God's will is that we make good decisions that allow us to love one another fully. But since the reign of God is yet fully realized, our failures make divorce necessary. On the other hand, Jesus does something revolutionary and places husband and wife together on equal footing in the relationship.

Children are the living hope of the future. That is why "a man leaves his father and mother and joins himself to his wife, and they become one body" (Genesis 2:24). Facing the future together as a family is becoming harder in our time. How can we approach God's life if we do not experience the difference between childish and childlike? To be childlike is to gain access to holiness. Jesus showed us how to be God's children. Happy are we!
