**OCTOBER – Month of the Holy Rosary**

We must not harden our hearts to the work of God in our lives. Otherwise, we will become an evil generation that only seeks signs and miracles, like in today's Gospel. At every Mass, Jesus miraculously becomes present through sacramental sign and word of the holy Eucharist. There is truly something greater than Jonah and all the prophets here. Jesus is here gently inviting us to turn back our hearts to him and return to the Lord.

**FIRST READING** (Wisdom 7:7-11) Much of the wisdom literature in the Old Testament is attributed to King Solomon, known for his wisdom. Today's text speaks of his prayer for the gift of wisdom, a gift esteemed more than earthly riches or even health. In 1 Kings 3 we read of his prayer for the gift of an understanding heart and discernment between right and wrong. Do we pray for this same wisdom?

**RESPONSORIAL PSALM** (Psalm 90:12-13, 14-15, 16-17) The verses we pray are an apt response to the First Reading's proclamation about wisdom. We ask not only to know how to value the days of our lives, but also to learn to appreciate the lessons of times of trial. Our refrain recapitulates the message as we implore God to give us the only thing necessary: the love that gives meaning to life.

**SECOND READING** (Hebrews 4:12-13) God's word in scripture often serves as a mirror inviting us to see ourselves. It is a word that can expose the thoughts and reflections of our hearts. God sees what is there. Do we?

Just as the First Reading encourages us to seek true wisdom, this selection from Hebrews calls us to meditate on our appreciation of the word of God. Do we believe in its power? Do we consciously seek an encounter with the living God in Scripture? Do we allow that word to judge and guide our daily activities and attitudes? Do we seek the wisdom of the word beyond other values?

**GOPEL** (Mark 10:17-30 or 10:17-27) Again and again we hear in the scriptures that observing the commandments is not enough in our relationship with the Lord. Is our heart entirely with him, or are other things more important? So it was for the rich young man in today's Gospel. Sadly, he did not recognize the abundant return Jesus gives to those who give up all to follow him. Jesus reminds the man in the passage of the Commandments that refer to human relationships, and the man claims to have lived without transgressing them. Then Jesus looks at him with the discerning gaze that tenderly lays bare the heart. Having searched the man's soul, Jesus invites him to follow him in truly fulfilling the Commandments by giving his very self for others. With that, the wealthy man's enthusiasm disappears and he who had run to kneel before Jesus turns away, utterly disenchanted. As the man left, Jesus addressed his followers to underscore the fact that the invitation he had issued applied to them as well as to the retreating rich man.

**REFLECTION** The Scripture readings today provide us with many tools for right living, and yet, our lives are never on a straight line. There are always the obstacles of sin, human weakness, and our own limitations. Mark's account of the Gospel tells us, "It is easier for a camel to pass through the eye of a needle than for one who is rich to enter the kingdom of God" (Mark 10:24). The reality is difficult things will be asked of all of us throughout our lives. The *Rule of Saint Benedict* has a chapter called "The Assignment of Impossible Tasks." When a monk was asked to do something, he should accept the order; but, if the burden was too much for the monk, he could explain gently to the superior why he couldn't do the job. The superior might relent, or may say "do it anyway" and then the monk, "trusting in God's help . . . must in love obey. That isn't just a story for those who live in monasteries, but a story for all of us. Sometimes we may not know how we will finish a task at work; get through a crying baby's illness; pay all the bills for our household, company, or parish; or overcome an addiction. Pray about it and tell God—then entrust it to God.

As Blessed Pope John Paul II wrote in 2002, "the Rosary... is a prayer loved by countless Saints and encouraged by the Magisterium. Simple yet profound, it still remains, at the dawn of this third millennium, a prayer of great significance, destined to bring forth a harvest of holiness.... With the Rosary, the Christian people sit at the school of Mary and are led to contemplate the beauty on the face of Christ and to experience the depths of his love. Through the Rosary, the faithful receive abundant grace, as though from the very hands of the Mother of the Redeemer" (Rosarium Virginis Mariae, 1).

We welcome any visitors, including those who may not be of our Catholic faith. We pray that our celebration of the sacred liturgy today was a meaningful one for you.

**Baptism** - A preparation class is required of the parents requesting Baptism for their first child. Parents and godparents are encouraged to attend the class before the baby’s birth. (Scheduled as needed.)

**Confirmation** - Confirmation is celebrated in the spring with students who are at least in the 8<sup>th</sup> grade and have completed the requirements for the preparation process in our PRE program.

**Matrimony** - Couples planning to marry should contact the Pastor at least 5 months prior to the proposed date so all parish and diocesan requirements may be completed.

**Holy Orders** - If you feel called to a vocation in the priesthood or religious life, please contact the pastor.
