

JUNE -- Month of the Sacred Heart of Jesus

This great solemnity marks the conclusion of Easter Time. As the 50 days of celebrating Christ's Resurrection comes to a close today, another new beginning burst forth powerfully into our lives: the coming of the Holy Spirit. Pentecost recalls and makes present in our lives the advent of the Spirit, which empowered the followers of Christ to proclaim the Gospel message and carry it throughout the world. Reminiscent of the confusion of tongues at the tower of Babel, the Spirit restores God's order at Pentecost by empowering the Apostles to communicate the Good News of God's salvation to all without the hindrance of language barriers. Truly, the Spirit demonstrates God's power to reach and communicate to all. Pentecost invites us to consider the movement of the spirit in our own lives as well: in Baptism and Confirmation we have welcomed the Spirit, who continues to vivify the Christian life, thus enabling us to proclaim the Good News today.

FIRST READING (VIGIL/Genesis 11:1-9 or Exodus 19:3-8a, 16-20b or Ezekiel 37:1-14 or Joel 3:1-5) (SUNDAY/Acts of the Apostles 2:1-11) Pentecost was one of the three pilgrimage feasts of the Apostles, when all who were able came to the Temple in Jerusalem; thus, the presence of so many foreigners in Jerusalem that day. "All" the disciples were gathered in one place. Acts of the Apostles 1:13-14 identifies these disciples as the Eleven, Mary the Mother of Jesus, the women who journeyed with Jesus from Galilee to Jerusalem (Like 8:1-3; 23:49), and his relatives. The cosmic sign of the strong driving wind attracted the crowd. (In Greek, the language in which Acts of the Apostles was originally written, the same word is used for both "wind" and "spirit.") Note also the sign of "fire." The fruit of the Spirit's presence and work is the disciples' ability to proclaim the Gospel in various tongues and be understood by those who heard them.

RESPONSORIAL PSALM (VIGIL/Psalm 104:1-2, 24 & 35, 27-28, 29, 30) (SUNDAY/Psalm 104:1, 24, 29-30, 31, 34) As at the Vigil Mass, Psalm 104 is used, along with the same antiphon. There is some variation in the stanzas. Today's addition in the last stanza voices the desire that both God's glory and God's joy in his creation endure. The psalmist is intent on being "pleasing" to the Lord and finding joy in him. A beautiful theme for each of our lives! Some commentators have referred to this psalm as a poetic version of the first chapter of Genesis. God has created all and his spirit animates everything. Without it, there is no life. God's works are beautiful and they are renewed by God's graciousness.

SECOND READING (VIGIL/ Romans 8:22-27) (SUNDAY/1 Corinthians 12:3b-7, 12-13 or Romans 8:8-17) Paul makes a sharp contrast between living according to the flesh (by worldly standards) and living according to the Spirit, the gift of God's presence, life and power within us, received at Baptism. Note that this is the same Spirit, the same Power that raised Jesus from the dead. That's powerful power! The Spirit within us also prays within us, as it gently leads us back to our God. The Aramaic word Abba is best rendered as "Daddy." Home intimately God has united us to himself.

GOSPEL (VIGIL/John 7:37-39) (SUNDAY/John 20:19-13 or John 14:15-16, 23b-26) John's account of the appearance of Jesus has a strong point of emphasis: peace. Although they are fearful (and it appears doubting: he mentions that Jesus must show his hands and side) they are restored when they encounter him. The final verses of this passage are central to the theology of John. The gift of the Spirit is the source of the power to forgive sins. The image of the breath is evocative of the gift of life given to humanity in Genesis 2:7. Twice in today's Gospel, the Holy Spirit is referred to as an "Advocate." the Greek word *parakletos* means "one who intercedes or acts for the good of another." In other words, God's Holy Spirit continues Jesus' work on our behalf, the work of bringing us the fullness of life. Our job is to listen to the words spoken by God and obey them.

Pentecost As we celebrate Pentecost, it is important to remember the ongoing role of the Holy Spirit. It is the Spirit that inspired the authors of the Bible, it is the Spirit that guides those called on to interpret the Scriptures, and it is the Spirit that enables each of us to hear what God has to say. The Greek word for Pentecost (pentekoste) means "fiftieth," and in early Christianity it referred to the entire fifty days of Easter. The roots of Pentecost can be found in the Jewish festival of Weeks (Shavu'ot), the 50 day celebration following Passover (Exodus 23:16). It was a harvest festival in which the first fruits of the harvest were offered to God in gratitude. It eventually became associated with the giving of the Torah on Mount Sinai. Early Christians reinterpreted the Jewish festival as a commemoration of the coming of the Holy Spirit, since Acts records that the Holy Spirit came to the disciples when the festival of Pentecost was fulfilled (Acts 2:1-11). The celebration of Pentecost may begin on Saturday afternoon or evening with the Vigil. By the end of the 4th century in the West, Pentecost became a time for the initiation of those not baptized at Easter. Thus, a night vigil was added like the Easter Vigil for this purpose. With this early history in mind, this is a most appropriate time to initiate those who were not ready at the Easter Vigil, or (not and) to celebrate the Reception of Baptized Christians into the Full Communion of the Catholic Church (RCIA, 473). One of the familiar and memorable texts for this Sunday is the reading from the Acts of the Apostles. This passage recounts the great gathering of people who were speaking in their native languages about "the mighty acts of God." We return to Ordinary Time on the Monday after Pentecost, June 10th.

SACRAMENTS

Baptism - A preparation class is required of the parents requesting Baptism for their first child. Parents and godparents are encouraged to attend the class before the baby's birth.

Confirmation - Confirmation is celebrated in the spring with students who are at least in the 8th grade and have completed the requirements for the preparation process in our PRE program.

Matrimony - Couples planning to marry should contact the Pastor at least 5 months prior to the proposed date so all parish and diocesan requirements may be completed.

Holy Orders - If you feel called to a vocation in the priesthood or religious life, please contact the pastor.

Anointing of the Sick - If you wish to receive this sacrament, contact the pastor. If there is an emergency situation, an immediate family member should contact the pastor.
