

OCTOBER — Month of the Most Holy Rosary In October, we celebrate a well-loved memorial in honor of the Rosary, and according to a long-standing tradition, the entire month of October is dedicated to the Most Holy Rosary. In the Rosary, with its sequence of prayers and mysteries, we contemplate the Gospel in company with the Blessed Virgin Mary. As Blessed Pope John Paul II wrote in 2002, “the Rosary...is a prayer loved by countless Saints and encouraged by the Magisterium. Simple yet profound, it still remains, at the dawn of this third millennium, a prayer of great significance, destined to bring forth a harvest of holiness.... With the Rosary, the Christian people sit at the school of Mary and are led to contemplate the beauty on the face of Christ and to experience the depths of his love. Through the Rosary, the faithful receive abundant grace, as though from the very hands of the Mother of the Redeemer” (*Rosarium Virginis Mariae*, 1).

Oct 6th — 27th Sunday in Ordinary Time (C) *Faith* is an interesting word. Yet *faith* is so much more than just a word. Jesus compares faith to the tiny mustard seed. Only a little bit of faith can cause amazing things to happen in our life. That gives us an important insight: faith leads to action. What we believe shapes how we live. Name some of the people who have passed on faith to you. Ask yourself, was it their words or their actions that rang true for you? As a Christian believer what actions in your life, at work or at home, in relationships or in private gestures, are based on your faith? The Creed that we say at Mass lists what we believe in. Take a few moments and write down an action creed; begin with “because I believe, this what I do, or how I act, or I resolve to ...” and include those things you do that arise from your faith.

SACRAMENTS

Baptism - A preparation class is required of the parents requesting Baptism for their first child. Parents and godparents are encouraged to attend the class before the baby's birth.

Confirmation is celebrated in the spring with students who are at least in the 8th grade and have completed the requirements for the preparation process in our PRE program.

Matrimony - Couples planning to marry should contact the Pastor at least 5 months prior to the proposed date so all parish and diocesan requirements may be completed.

Holy Orders - If you feel called to a vocation in the priesthood or religious life, please contact the pastor.

Anointing of the Sick - If you wish to receive this sacrament, contact the pastor. If there is an emergency situation, an immediate family member should contact the pastor.

OCTOBER - Month of the Most Holy Rosary

Jesus Christ was a great teacher and the metaphor of the mustard seed is another example of his wise approach to teaching the faith. Mustard seeds are tiny, making it an encouraging and accessible image for those who hear it. Even a tiny bit of faith is enough for the radical transformation to begin in us toward the fullness of life promised by God. Faith is our response to God's invitation to eternal life, an invitation that is continual and comes in so many ways. Like a mustard seed, the seed of faith will mature and flourish as we grow in our relationship with God through Jesus Christ.

FIRST READING (Habakkuk 1:2-3; 2:2-4) This passage is in two parts. The first is the cry of the prophet who believes that God does not listen or intervene in his misery. The second part is God's response. God's response is not so much an answer but a vision which the prophet is to write down so all can know it. The content of the vision is not stated but it has the purpose of stating that the events of life are in the mind of God and his plan will not disappoint.

It takes great faith not to lose hope in God in times of deep suffering and affliction. Habakkuk, in today's First Reading, exhorts his hearers to faith and hope. We may think of the word "vision" (which occurs twice) as all God has promised, all that hope encompasses. This hope has its time—it *will* come to fruition. The promises will be fulfilled. We must only have faith.

RESPONSORIAL PSALM (Psalm 95:1-2, 6-7, 8-9) Psalm 95 is a hymn of joyful thanksgiving for the actions of the Lord. Three times the psalmist invites the people to acknowledge the Lord: "Come, let us sing"; "Let us come into his presence"; and "Come, let us bow down." The image of a shepherd is attributed to God and the psalmist pleads with the people to hear the voice of the shepherd.

Hear the word of the Lord and receive it—in your heart. Psalm 95 calls us to humble obedience to the God in whom we find strength.

SECOND READING (2 Timothy 1:6-8, 13-14) Paul encourages his disciple Timothy to be courageous and faithful in bearing witness to the Gospel. Perhaps Timothy has been timid in his "testimony to our Lord." So Paul reminds him of his own struggles, including being imprisoned, and exhorts Timothy to be mindful of the strength that comes from God and from the Help of the Holy Spirit that "dwells within us."

Bear your hardships, encourages Paul, fan into even stronger flames the fervor of your zeal for the Gospel. Embrace in your heart the rich deposit of faith the Church teaches.

GOSPEL (Luke 17:5-10) The Apostles are concerned with their lack of faith, which they assume has to do with a certain quantity that needs to be increased. Jesus tells them that even if their faith is the size of a mustard seed they will be able to do what they have been asked to do. Jesus' image of the mustard seed speaks of the quality of a commitment to their ministry and rather than a concern for how much or how great the results they accomplish.

Today's Gospel consists of two rather independent sayings or teachings. The first begins with a request or prayer: "Increase our faith." Jesus' response points out the strength and power of even a little faith. The second part of the Gospel is the parable of a servant. How easy it is to think only of what we shall receive in return for whatever we do. Before the Lord, however, we are servants and whatever we do is only what we have been commanded.
